ORDINANCE 123336

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Mercer Corridor Project; redesignating a portion of two parcels of property owned by the City and needed to construct the Mercer Corridor Project from limited-access highway purposes to general-street purposes; one parcel being a portion of Parcel 40, Block 2, Eden Addition, and the other parcel being a portion of Parcel 57, Block 81, Lake Union Shoreland Addition.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 122505 authorized the Director of the Seattle Department of Transportation to acquire all properties needed to complete the Mercer Corridor Project; and

WHEREAS, among the properties needed to complete the Mercer Corridor Project are portions of Parcels 40 and 57, shown respectively in Attachments A and B to this ordinance; which were acquired in 1971 for the Bay Freeway Project, which was never built; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 97740, which accepted Parcel 40, designated the use as general-street purposes; and Ordinance 100254, which accepted the remainder of Parcel 40 and all of Parcel 57, designated the use as limited-access highway purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to use a portion of Parcel 40 and a portion of Parcel 57 to construct the Mercer Corridor Project and for general-street purposes; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That portion of Parcel 40 as described below, which was designated by Ordinance 100254 as being for limited-access highway purposes, is redesignated for general-street purposes:

That portion of Lot 5, Block 2, Eden Addition to the City of Seattle, according to the plat thereof as recorded in Volume 1 of Plats, page 61A, records of King County, Washington State, described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of said Lot 5, Block 2, Thence S 01° 28' 45" W along the Easterly line of said Lot 5, a distance of 10.00 feet, Thence N 88° 32' 53" W, a distance of 108.07 feet to the Easterly margin of Dexter Avenue according to that condemnation in King County Superior Court under Cause

Beginning at the Southwest corner of said Lot 1,

Thence N 01° 27' 03" E along the West line thereof, also being the East margin of 9th Avenue North, a distance of 12.21 feet,

Thence S 88° 04' 27" E a distance of 24.57 feet to the Southerly line of said Lot 1, also being the Northerly margin of Broad Street,

Thence S 65° 25' 16" W along the Southerly line of said Lot 1, and the Northerly margin of Broad Street, a distance of 27.35 feet to the True Point of Beginning.

Containing 150 square feet, more or less.



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

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Mercer Corridor Project; redesignating a portion of two parcels of property owned by the City and needed to construct the Mercer Corridor Project from limited-access highway purposes to general-street purposes; one parcel being a portion of Parcel 40, Block 2, Eden Addition, and the other parcel being a portion of Parcel 57, Block 81, Lake Union Shoreland Addition.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation changes the designation of a portion of two parcels owned by the City from limited-access highway purposes to general-street purposes. The two parcels, Parcel 40, Block 2, Eden Addition and Parcel 57, Block 81, Lake Union Shorelands, were originally purchased for the Bay Freeway Project, which was never built. The limited-access highway designation is no longer needed and approximately 1,081 square feet of Parcel 40 and 150 square feet of Parcel 57 would be changed to general-street purposes, allowing the property to be used for the Mercer Corridor Project.
