NEW</i></p> <p><i>Mr. Block is a resident of Madison Park, member of the Arboretum Foundation, and a frequent visitor to, and user of, the Arboretum. He received a B.S. in Journalism from the University of Colorado and has been a reporter and producer for PBS, The MacNeil-Lehrer News Hour, and MSNBC with Brian Williams. For the past 10 years, he has been a media and communications consultant.</i></p> <p><i>He served 7 years on the board of Conservation Northwest and worked on the Cascade Conservation Partnership which helped purchase and protect over 25,000 acres of valuable habitat in the heart of the Cascades, along the I-90 corridor. Mr. Block, who strongly favored removing the fence at Madison Park, was invited by Seattle Parks to serve on the committee that helped design the new waterfront area after the removal.</i></p> <p><i>Mr. Block worked for over 3 years to help restore the Volunteer Lily Ponds and the "Dinosaur Bone" sculpture in the nearby kids play area. He is now a volunteer with the newly-created Volunteer Park Trust, working with Seattle Parks to create a long-term plan and private fundraising to help Parks fund and revitalize Volunteer Park for future generations. In addition, Mr. Block has been an active board member of Town Hall Seattle for the past 10 years.</i></p>
