1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Mike Omura at 5:17 pm

2. Items Requiring Council Action/Approval

- a. **Resolution 12-08-08-01:** We, the Seattle Chinatown International District Preservation and Development Authority Council, approve the July, 2012 Council Minutes.

3. Management Report

Vern Wood reported on expenses for the month of June and noted that there were extraordinary expenses because of the gate which was added at Legacy House as well as dues which were paid for the historic alley project. Additionally, Vern referred to the Management Report and indicated that the report for August is the full quarterly report rather than the summarized version. She explained that the gap in revenue was closed because grants had been received; and that expenses were over budget largely due to maintenance expenses. Vern said ICHS development fees will not be received until 2013.

Tommy Tomlinson briefly reported on the Annual Open House at Legacy House and said that this year there were 24 referral sources present rather than the 16 who attended in the previous year. She said that Council members Karen Yoshitomi, Scott Yasui, and Michael Itti were in attendance and really enjoyed meeting the seniors.

Josephine Tamayo Murray reported that Senior Services Committee would be reviewing changes to policies and procedures that Legacy House staff have been working on.

In Barbara Cole's absence, Vern reported that property management staff have been working to improve maintenance projects to get a better handle on improving efficiencies. She also mentioned that a Letter of Intent is to be signed the next day for commercial space in the Bush.

Joyce Pisananont promoted Nihonmachi Nite which was scheduled for Saturday, August 11; and said that on the same night the Bruce Lee Film Festival would begin. Joyce was happy to report on grants which had been recently awarded, the Bank of America grant for \$20k, and the MetLife grant for \$20k.

4. Council Business

Finance Committee – Vern Wood talked about some of the expenses included in the financials which included the purchase of new computers, and the annual fire maintenance and HVAC expenses at IDVS1. David Chang said there would not be a Finance Committee meeting in July.

Executive Committee – Mike Omura said the City Council's Committee on Planning, Land Use, and Sustainability confirmed the election of Rita Brogan, Scott Yasui and Kip Tokuda to the SCIDpda Council.

Council members discussed the Yesler Terrace development project. Karen Yoshitomi asked if the SCIDpda should prepare a position paper. Maiko said that at the June Council meeting it was decided the PDA would remain neutral rather than taking a position. Karen said she thinks there should be some additional research done and because of the PDA's mission a statement should be prepared. Council members will have further discussion on what impact the development project will be on Little Saigon, and if it will enhance economic opportunities in Little Saigon for businesses.



Mike Omura adjourned the meeting at 5:56 pm.




