At his hometown performing arts center, Proctors, he created programs to engage youth with arts, and proceeded to begin QFEST, the first LGBT film festival in Upstate New York. The festival brought new audiences to Proctors and new films that he selected, including the now widely-viewed documentary, <i>Bully</i>. The film festival's proceeds were donated to a local LGBT youth program.</p> <p>Recently, he initiated a partnership between Proctors and a local LGBT center to provide a safe space for Queer Youth Groups. Joey's strong leadership skills and commitment to LGBT issues, expression, and youth voice will be an excellent contribution to Seattle's LGBT Commission and Get Engaged program.</p>
