RESOLUTION 31468

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3 A RESOLUTION granting conceptual approval for Puget Sound Bike Share to construct,
4 maintain, and operate a bike-share program in public places located within Major
5 Institution Overlay Districts, designated Urban Centers and Urban Villages, and
6 commercially- or industrially-zoned parcels lying between these areas in the City of
Seattle.

7 WHEREAS, the Puget Sound Bike Share is a Washington non-profit organization that will
8 operate a bike-share program in public places located within Major Institution Overlay
9 Districts, designated Urban Centers and Urban Villages, and commercially- or
10 industrially-zoned parcels lying between these areas in the Puget Sound region to provide
11 a low-cost, convenient transportation alternative for the public; and

12 WHEREAS, the bike-share program will provide an automated public bike-rental service
13 consisting of modular bike-share stations with docks for bicycles, payment kiosk, helmet-
14 vending kiosk, wayfinding signage, and a solar power structure providing power for the
15 bike-share station; and

16 WHEREAS, the Bicycle Master Plan adopted by Resolution 31024 set a goal of tripling the
17 amount of bicycling in Seattle between 2007 and 2017, and reducing the rate of bicycle
18 collisions by one-third in the same time frame; and

19 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle (City) is currently updating the 2007 Bicycle Master Plan, with a
20 vision to make riding a bicycle a comfortable and integral part of daily life in Seattle for
21 people of all ages and abilities; and

22 WHEREAS, the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) supports bike-share programs
23 because they provide a healthy, safe, and affordable travel option that has the potential to
24 attract new people to biking, and serve residents and visitors alike; and

25 WHEREAS, the Seattle Design Commission was briefed on the proposed bike-share program on
26 March 21, 2013, and will provide a recommendation on the final bike-share station
27 design as part of the technical review of the proposed bike-share program; and

28 WHEREAS, in making a recommendation, the SDOT Director considered the application
materials and proposed business plan for implementing the bike share program and
recommends that conceptual approval be granted; NOW, THEREFORE,



1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE**
2 **MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:**

3 Section 1. The City Council finds that the Puget Sound Bike Share (PSBS) program is in
4 the public interest.

5 Section 2. The City acknowledges PSBS will be entering into a contract with a vendor to
6 operate and maintain bike-share station facilities. Notwithstanding that a vendor will operate and
7 maintain bike-share stations under a contract with PSBS; PSBS shall be exclusively responsible
8 under the term permit for maintaining the bike-share stations, bicycles, or any other bike-share
9 equipment in good working order; and for complying with all term permit requirements.

10 Section 3. As conditions for obtaining permission to construct, maintain, and operate the
11 bike-share program, PSBS shall:
12

13 (a) Provide:

- 14 (i) An annual inventory of all bike-share station locations;
15 (ii) A surety bond in an amount determined by the City;
16 (iii) Liability insurance naming the City as an additional insured or self-
17 insurance, in an amount and form as approved by the City's Risk
18 Manager;
19 (iv) An annual certificate of insurance;
20 (v) A copy of all contracts PSBS enters into with a contractor to provide
21 bike-share services. The PSBS-contractor bike-share contract shall
22 include a provision that the contractor:
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- (1) Obtain liability insurance naming the City as an additional insured in an amount and form as approved by the City's Risk Manager;
- (2) Provide the City with an annual certificate of insurance; and
- (3) Indemnify the City, in a form approved by the City, against all claims or damages arising from the use or operation of the bike-share station, bicycles, or any other bike-share equipment the vendor provides under the contract;

(b) Indemnify the City, in a form approved by the City, against all claims or damages arising from the use or operation of the bike-share station, bicycles, or any other equipment provided by the contractor;

c) Obtain all necessary City permits for installing, removing, or relocating a bike-share station;

d) Pay all City permit fees; and

e) Remove the bike-share stations and restore the right-of-way to its original condition upon the program term permit expiring or at the direction of the Director or City Council according to the provisions of the term permit ordinance.

After this Resolution is adopted, SDOT will present to the City Council a draft program term permit ordinance identifying the conditions under which permission may be granted for the use of the right-of-way. Permission to use the right-of-way is subject to the Council's decision to approve, deny, or modify the draft program term permit ordinance presented by the Director.

Section 4. As recommended by the Director and the Mayor, conceptual approval for construction, maintenance, and operation of the bike-share program in public places within



1 Major Institution Overlay Districts, designated Urban Centers and Urban Villages, and
2 commercially- or industrially-zoned parcels lying between these areas in the City of Seattle as
3 proposed by Puget Sound Bike Share is GRANTED.

Legislation Title:

A RESOLUTION granting conceptual approval for Puget Sound Bike Share to construct, maintain, and operate a bike-share program in public places located within Major Institution Overlay Districts, and designated Urban Centers and Urban Villages in the City of Seattle.

Summary of the Legislation:

This proposed resolution grants the conceptual approval for Puget Sound Bike Share to construct, operate, and maintain a bike-share program in public places within Major Institution Overlays and designated Urban Centers and Urban Villages in the City of Seattle. The bike-share program will provide an automated public bike-rental service consisting of modular bike-share stations with docks for bicycles, payment kiosks, helmet-vending kiosks, wayfinding signage, and a solar power structure providing power for the bike-share station.

Background:

The Puget Sound Bike Share is a Washington non-profit organization that will operate a bike-share program in public places located within Major Institution Overlays and designated Urban Centers and Urban Villages in King County to provide a low-cost, convenient transportation alternative for the public. The Seattle Department of Transportation supports a bike-share program to provide a healthy, safe, and affordable travel option that has the potential to attract new people to biking, and serve residents and visitors alike.

The Bicycle Master Plan adopted by Resolution 31024 set a goal of tripling the amount of bicycling in Seattle between 2007 and 2017, and reducing the rate of bicycle collisions by one-third in the same time frame. The City is currently updating the 2007 Bicycle Master Plan, with a vision to make riding a bicycle a comfortable and integral part of daily life in Seattle for people of all ages and abilities.

The Seattle Design Commission was briefed on the proposed bike-share program on March 21, 2013, and will provide a recommendation on the final bike-share station design as part of the technical review of the proposed bike-share program.


