Background: <p>Susana Tat is in her first year of a Master of Public Health program at the University of Washington.</p> <p>For two years, she worked as a public health associate with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on projects in HIV/STD prevention, Emergency Preparedness, and in Maternal and Child Health. This work allowed her to develop exceptional communication skills during communications with diverse groups while conducting HIV counseling at rehabilitation centers and working with other government officials in emergency preparedness planning. Through these projects, Susana learned the functions and roles of local and federal public health agencies.</p> <p>Susana recently completed a practicum at Public Health – Seattle and King County in the Violence and Injury Prevention Program where she conducted legislative reviews on gun violence bills and made recommendations on policy.</p> <p>Susana currently works as a research assistant at the University of Washington, conducting research on the health of women who have sex with women (lesbians, bisexuals, and those who self-identify differently). Her work experience has made her particularly aware of the health issues that affect women, particularly those that affect sexual minorities. As the president of the Student Public Health Association at the UW, she represents the student voice in meetings with department chairs and the dean of the school.</p> <p>Susana strongly believes in social justice, equality, and empowerment. As a queer Asian woman in public health, she hopes to become an invaluable voice on the Women's Commission, one that can connect with both the community and the government.</p>
