

<b>Comments: Appointment</b>  My name is Noory Lee and I identify as a queer Korean American among other identities. Although I was born in Texas, Dallas, I grew up in South Korea most of my childhood and immigrated to United States at 5th grade. Holding my privilege as a U.S. citizen while identifying with most of the immigrant experience was a complex part of my identity growing up. Fast forward through my turbulent teenage years, I attended Highline Community College as a Running Start student in which changed my anticipated trajectory of becoming a doctor. I then moved on to major in psychology at Seattle University and pursued career within student affairs in higher education. Somewhere during that time, I started to become politicized as I did deeper self exploration of examining my own experience of marginalization and became involved in community organizing. After seeking other communities of support, I joined Sahngnoksoo, a radical Korean American activist group, and Zenyu Healing Center, a multicultural organization for LGBTQI of color. Currently I'm called to do my work as an educator and community organizer but there are other works that I'm starting to explore as part of my calling such as becoming involved with the Seattle LGBT commission. On a less serious note, I love to dance Zumba or learn break dancing and tinkering away on various small craft projects at home.
