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

Overview

Ross Tilghman has 28 years experience developing transportation plans for government, not-for-profit and private sector clients. His strengths include:

Experience and Skills

Ross Tilghman frequently works with internationally recognized teams of planning, design and finance professionals to develop innovative transportation solutions in both urban and rural locations.

- **Master Planning & Comprehensive Planning** – forecasting travel demands; determining appropriate road, transit and parking capacity; recommending new road alignments, road cross-sections, intersection configurations, parking locations and layouts; modifying zoning requirements for parking; estimating transportation-generated carbon emissions; and developing transportation demand management actions.
- **Parking Development and Financial Feasibility Analysis** – projecting parking demand including shared-parking potential; analyzing market characteristics of existing facilities and users; identifying market potential for future facilities; recommending appropriate supply; projecting revenue and expense to identify net revenues available for debt service; coordinating with finance specialists to determine supportable debt; creating business plans for enterprise systems.
- **Park and Zoo Planning** – defining visitor arrival sequence and wayfinding; identifying internal circulation requirements for motorized and non-motorized modes; determining vehicle performance and power source requirements for internal shuttles & people-movers; surveying visitors to identify trip characteristics; analyzing parking demand and supply; developing employee and visitor parking management strategies.
- **Recreation and Special Event Transportation Strategies** – identifying design-day travel demands and frequency of major events; developing access and parking plans to minimize circulation and conflicts between vehicles and pedestrians; sizing parking facilities and coordinating signage plans.

- **Transit Market Analysis** – forecasting ridership for shuttle and light-rail services; surveying existing users; identifying shuttle routes and capacity requirements.
- **Historic Preservation Planning** – creating parking and circulation plans to preserve historic structures, to reduce traffic demands on historic roads, to maintain historic integrity in locally and nationally designated historic districts, and to comply with 4(f) and Section 106 requirements.
- **Traffic Impact Analysis** – conducting all steps of environmental impact analyses (SEPA/NEPA) from data collection, to trip generation/distribution/mode-choice/assignment and review of travel model results, to operational analysis using HCS/Synchro, to development and evaluation of mitigation measures.
- **Peer Review and Expert Witness Services** – conducting technical review of transportation studies for reasonableness of assumptions, accuracy, internal consistency, and compliance with SEPA, local concurrency and zoning ordinances. Testimony at land use hearings.
- **Presentations** – explaining procedures, findings and recommendations to elected officials, agency representatives, steering committees and the general public. Conducting media interviews.
