

Background: Anita Khandelwal holds a B.A. in Anthropology from Yale University, and holds a J.D. from Yale University. Anita's work since law school has been driven by her commitment to equality and individual liberty and dignity. Her work has focused exclusively on the area of civil rights, human rights, and criminal justice reform. As a staff attorney and Soros Justice Fellow at the Racial Disparity Project at The Defender Association, Anita spent two years working on local ordinances and local police practices that have a disparate impact on people of color. Anita drafted alternative policies which were ultimately adopted by the police department. As a fellow at Relman & Dane, Anita worked on policies that excluded Blacks and families with children from housing under the Fair Housing Act. As an intern at the ACLU Drug Law Reform Project, Anita worked on a lawsuit challenging the wrongful arrest and conviction of 15 African-American residents of Hearne, Texas for drug crimes. Anita believes the Commission can play a valuable role in advising the City about the most just, humane, and effective policies.
