Biography of Maggie Walker

Maggie Walker was born and raised in Summit, New Jersey. She attended Oak Knoll School until 1968, when she moved to Greenville, South Carolina where she met Doug Walker. Both attended Vanderbilt University, then married and moved to Scattle to attend the University of Washington where Maggie earned degrees in both History and Journalism and Doug did graduate work in Mathematics.

For fifteen years, Maggie worked in the commercial furnishings and design industry in the Northwest, while Doug started WRQ, a software firm. Since the birth of her only child, she has continued as a design and art consultant, as well as becoming very active in the non-profit community.

She is a Past President of the Board of Trustees of the Henry Art Gallery at UW and a past Chair of the Woodland Park Zoological Society's Board of Directors. Maggie is also past Chair of the Board of the Washington Women's Foundation, and is Immediate Past President of the Seattle Art Museum board. She and Doug were co-founders of Social Venture Partners.

Maggie is Immediate Past Chair of the Seattle Foundation board. She is a board member of the University of Washington Foundation, chairing the Advisory Board of the College of the Environment. She is Past President of the ARCS Foundation Seattle Chapter and Past Chair of the Board of the Museum of History and Industry. Maggie also served as Chair of the Bullitt Foundation Board of Directors for six years and was Co-Chair of the Prosperity Partnership's Cultural Task Force, She is a past Vice-President of the board of Washington Audubon and Seattle Children's Home. She and Doug also co-chaired the Campaign for Lake Union Park, and are currently co-chairing the North Cascades Initiative for the Wilderness Society. Recently, Maggie was re-appointed Co-Chair of the Central Waterfront Committee for a 2 year term and joined the board of Global Partnerships. She is Chair of the newly formed Friends of Waterfront Seattle non-profit, created to support the waterfront project.

Welcome

 Winnie Stratton, President, welcomed the committee members and called for approval of the September 11 meeting minutes. The motion was made, seconded and approved.

ArtHit

Kim Rorschach, Director, presented the ArtHit on an upcoming installation by artist, Jaume
Plensa, Echo, as a proposed gift by Trustee, Barney Ebsworth. Engineering studies are currently
being done for plans to install it at the Olympic Sculpture Park. A projected installation date has
not yet been determined. Kim acknowledged Barney for his gift of the significant work.

President's Report

- Winnie provided a recap of the recent events for Peru: Kingdoms of the Sun and the Moon exhibition.
 - O Over 450 guests attended the Opening Celebration which included many members of the Peruvian delegation.
 - Over 2,000 members attended the all members preview noting it as one of the topattendance results among SAM's Gauguin and Picasso exhibitions.
 - O Over 550 guests attended the Premier Members event
 - o Following the opening events, SAM held the 5th Annual Diwall Ball to a sold-out crowd of 730 guests. Staff will be looking at ways to maximize the event success for future events.
- Executive Committee approval was requested to re-nominate Trustee, Maggie Walker, for another three-year term on the Museum Development Authority (MDA) Council. SAM has three representatives on the 9-member Council, the other two of which are Trustees, Doug Norberg and Robert Strong.
- Winnie called for motion to approve the re-nomination of Maggie Walker. The motion was made by Board Secretary, Stewart Landefeld, seconded by Board Vice President, Jon Shirley, and approved by unanimous consent.

Director's Report

- Kim Rorschach, Director, started her report welcoming SAM's new Development Director, Chris Landman, to the meeting.
- Kim reported on the admissions results for the first week of the Peru exhibition through October 20. Attendance has come in at 104% of projections and revenue at 122% of projections.
- A strategic planning update was given and a pre-planning session with JUMP associates has been confirmed for November 16-17 to include Officers and Executive Committee members along with senior staff members. In addition, representatives are being recruited with desired demographic backgrounds from Starbucks, Amazon and Microsoft to participate in part of the two-day session.
 - Following the JUMP session, a pre-planning SWOT analysis open session with staff will be planned before year-end as well as a larger-scale 2-day planning session with board, selected staff and community members to be planned for January or February.
- Kim reported that SAM BOOKS is up and running. The SAM Gallery renovations at SAM SHOP are still underway.

- Kim presented preliminary plans for proposed renovations to the Seattle Asian Art Museum at Volunteer Park.
- In addition to the infrastructure and seismic improvements, Kim reported that the concept design of proposed renovations would include:
 - O Expanding main floor with anew gallery space.
 - o Introduce lighting to space in the Garden Court and adding a staircase to connect to an improved pre-function space.
 - e Existing office spaces will be converted into an expanded education and meeting space.
 - o Improvements to the loading dock.
 - o Office spaces will be moved into basement level.
- The total project cost is currently being estimated at \$36 40 Million in which the City would be
 asked and expected to fund about half through the Parks Levy funds, historic tax credit, and
 escalator provisions.
- Discussion continued on the topic and ideas for further exploration.
- A motion was made and seconded, to move forward with implementing feasibility of the
 project, and Kim was granted on behalf of the Executive Committee to continue exploration and
 report back.

Finance Report

Bob Cundall, Chief Operating Officer, reported on the FY14 YTD financial results.
