

CITY OF SEATTLE

COUNCIL BILL _____

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2013, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Seattle Police Department, Human Services Department, Department of Planning and Development, Department of Parks and Recreation, Department of Finance and Administrative Services, Department of Transportation, Seattle City Light, and Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor or his designees, the Chief of Police, the Director of the Human Services Department, the Director of Planning and Development, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Director of Finance and Administrative Services, the Director of Transportation, the General Manager and CEO of Seattle City Light, and the Director of Seattle Public Utilities are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below, and to execute, deliver, and perform on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as C.B. [117890](#).
