activity in downtown Seattle and neighborhood commercial districts. The Mayor's 2015-2016 Proposed Budget for OED included the following funding for Access Seattle:

- \$135,000 GSF in 2015 and 2016 for the salary of a new 1.0 FTE Strategic Advisor 2 position that would have provided businesses impacted by large-scale construction projects with outreach services and other assistance.
- \$8,000 GSF in 2015 for equipment purchases and office space planning activities associated with the proposed Strategic Advisor 2 position.

OED piloted elements of Access Seattle in 2014 by using its existing resources to hire temporary staff. The initiative does not yet have any permanent staff support or reserved program funds within OED. The 2015-2016 Proposed Budget for SDOT includes additional funding for Access Seattle.
