4	AN ORDINANCE relating to the Office of Arts & Culture; authorizing the Director of the
5 6	Office of Arts & Culture to set fees and charges for the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute.
7	WHEREAS, the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute was transferred from the jurisdiction
8	of the Department of Parks and Recreation to the Office of Arts & Culture with the 2013 Adopted Budget; and
9	WHEREAS, it is necessary to change the fees and charges relating to the use of the Langston
10	Hughes Performing Arts Institute in conjunction with the 2015 Adopted Budget; and
11	WHEREAS, the Director of the Office of Arts & Culture should have the authority to change fees and charges for the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute to reflect market
12	conditions at comparable venues; NOW, THEREFORE,
13	
14	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:
15	Section 1. Section 3.14.815 of the Seattle Municipal Code, which was last amended by
16	Ordinance 124539, is amended as follows:
17	3.14.815 Director—duties
18	The Director of the Office of Arts and Culture shall be the head of and responsible for the
19	administration of the Office of Arts and Culture. Under the direction of the Mayor, the duties of
20	the Director of the Office of Arts and Culture shall include the following:

22	K. Set fees and charges for the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute that compete
22	with market pricing at comparable venues. In setting these fees and charges, the Director is not
23	subject to the provisions of Chapter 3.02 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Office of Arts & Culture; authorizing the Director of the Office of Arts & Culture to set fees and charges for the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute.

Summary of the Legislation:

This Ordinance will give the Director of the Office of Arts & Culture (Arts) the authority to change fees and charges for the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute (LHPAI) to compete with comparable venues.

Background:

Fees and charges relating to the use of LHPAI were previously contained in the Department of Parks and Recreation's (Parks) Fee Schedule when the facility was under the Parks umbrella. Now that LHPAI is being administered by Arts, Arts will need legislative authority to change fees and charges.

The nature of LHPAI means that it competes with other venues for rentals. This legislation will allow the Arts Director to respond to changing market conditions in establishing appropriate fees for LHPAI.

LHPAI maintains a fee structure for all its rentals ranging from free to full recovery of costs. This proposed fee change will ensure that:

- Current fees are in alignment with comparable facility fees and amenities in the marketplace.
- Theater lamp use fees will be required to help LHPAI establish a reserve account for future replacement of the costly lamp fixture.

Attachment A shows the proposed fee schedule including references to fees previously charged for rentals and services at LHPAI while part of Parks.

Total Revenue Notes:

A portion of the fee revenue generated by LHPAI is budgeted to support the operations of the program (deposited in the Arts Account). The remainder of the revenue is collected in the Arts Commission Donation Fund (in a separate project), and LHPAI may use these funds to support programming and other costs at the facility.

Other Implications:

- a) Does the legislation have indirect financial implications, or long-term implications? If approved, this legislation has indirect financial implications. It will allow the Arts Director to set fees for LHPAI. Attachment A to this fiscal note is what the Arts Director has indicated that the Office is likely to charge, given the authority, beginning January 2015. The resulting difference between 2015 anticipated revenues and 2014 actual revenues is expected to be negligible.
- b) What is the financial cost of not implementing the legislation?

This legislation addresses confusion made when LHPAI was transferred from Parks to Arts as part of the 2013 budget process. Although jurisdiction was transferred and LHPAI fees were removed from the Parks and Recreation Fee Schedule, the ability to set fees was not explicitly placed under Arts. This legislation remedies that. In 2014, LHPAI fees were unchanged from the 2013 fees under Parks. This legislation is needed to allow the Arts Director to set fees, keeping charges competitive at market rates while providing income to LHPAI.

Fee Schedule -- Office of Arts & Culture / Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute

The tables below identify all proposed fees for various services, uses and rentals at the Langston Hughes Performing Arts Institute ("LHPAI"), within the Office of Arts & Culture ("Arts"). LHPAI was previously managed by the Department of Parks and Recreation ("Parks").

Theater

The use fees for the historical, 287-seat LHPAI vary by length and type of use. To further maintain the theater, no taping or tacking of decorations or meeting materials to walls, windows, fixtures, lighting or seating areas is permitted. Theater furniture, fixtures, curtains, and equipment may not be moved. **Please NOTE the following:**

- Theatre rentals may require additional labor charges for the theater and a technical staff person, with overtime and or City of Seattle ("City") holidays charged at the approved City rates of pay.
- A maintenance fee will be required for audiences and activities when the use will impact the normal maintenance standard of the facility. The City is self-insured, however each use requires an accord form (certificate of additional insured) naming the City, Arts, and LHPAI as additional insured paid by the renter (coverage amount is based on estimated attendance and type of event).
- An additional charge is required for the use of certain types of facility equipment, subject to availability.
- Theater rental includes new categories for use of theater lamp during general types of productions, presentations, performances, and rehearsals depending on approved lighting use.
