COUNCIL BILL	

AN ORDINANCE relating to City employment; amending Ordinance 124035 to remove a sunset date and revise reporting requirements.

WHEREAS, as part of the 2013 budget process, the City Council passed Ordinance 124035, which established 25 unfunded positions in the Seattle Department of Human Resources to be used by City departments to perform work that otherwise would be contracted out; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 124035 contains a provision requiring the sunset of those positions no later than December 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the creation and use of these positions has been critical in helping the City to retain employees who may have been subject to layoff; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to continue to support the goals of Ordinance 124035; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 124035 required the Personnel Director (now known as the Seattle Human Resources Director) to report annually to the City Council's Government Performance and Finance Committee on the use of the positions created; and

WHEREAS, the City Budget Office is better situated to monitor the use of these positions and to report to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 of Ordinance 124035 are amended as follows: Section 1. As requested by the ((Personnel)) Seattle Human Resources Director and recommended by the Mayor, there are hereby created 25 unfunded positions in the ((Personnel)) Seattle Department of Human Resources. The positions are not exempt from the City's Civil Service system. ((The positions shall be designated as sunset positions, and shall sunset no later than December 31, 2014.))

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Section 2. City departments may request use of these unfunded positions to retain work within their department that they might otherwise have contracted out to non-city employees. The ((Personnel)) Seattle Human Resources Director shall establish the criteria for use of these positions and make the final determination on whether the City department's request meets the criteria. Section 3. The ((Personnel)) Seattle Human Resources Director is authorized to fill, or to loan to other departments to fill, these 25 unfunded positions. These positions shall be funded by the existing budget authority of departments that utilize the positions. The ((Personnel)) Seattle Human Resources Director shall determine the appropriate classification of these positions from among existing City classifications. Section 4. ((The Personnel Director shall provide an annual report to the City Council's Government Performance and Finance Committee, on the use of these positions including the financial savings. The Personnel Director shall include all positions created by this Ordinance that have been classified or filled on the Personnel Departments' Annual Citywide Position List.)) As part of future Proposed Budgets, the City Budget Office will submit to

Position List.)) As part of future Proposed Budgets, the City Budget Office will submit to the City Council a review of the use of each of these positions, including the nature of work, duration of positions, number of hours of work, and the amount of money saved by using these positions.

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Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020. signed by me in open session in authentication of its passage this _____ day of ________, 2014. Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to City employment; amending Ordinance 124035 to remove a sunset date and revise reporting requirements.

Summary of the Legislation:

This legislation removes the December 31, 2014 sunset date for twenty-five (25) unfunded positions established in Ordinance 124035 to return work within City departments that otherwise would be contracted out. This legislation also removes the annual report by the Seattle Human Resources Director to the City Council's Government Performance and Finance Committee on the use of these positions. Instead, the City Budget Office, as part of future Proposed Budgets, will provide City Council with a review the use of each of these positions including the nature of work, duration of positions, and number of hours of work.

Background:

In November 2012, twenty-five (25) unfunded, sunsetting positions were established to allow City departments to retain employees that could perform bodies of work less costly than having the work contract out. In 2014, an analysis by the Seattle Department of Human Resources and the City Budget Office determined a sustained need for these positions and removing the sunset date will allow the City to recruit employees into and retain employees in these positions.
