

Councilmember Harrell,

I would like to be considered for appointment to the Office of Professional Accountability (OPA) Review Board.

Before delving as to how my professional experience may be a great complement to the OPA Review Board, I thought it would be helpful to first provide a bit of background in regard to my experience as a Seattle citizen and community member.

My wife and I moved to Seattle in 2004. In the ensuing seven years we have both become very involved with our neighborhood as well as becoming quite familiar with the Seattle Police Department (SPD). In particular, 2007 was a year of high contact with the SPD as our car was stolen twice and also hit by a drunk driver. As a consequence of our experience, we have become active in crime prevention in our neighborhood. My wife is the captain of our block watch and we frequently attend community meetings that impact crime and the environment.

In Spring 2011 I attended the Seattle PD's Community Police Academy. It was an enlightening experience and further stimulated my interest in the SPD. I left the Academy pondering how I could help the SPD better serve the citizens of Seattle and where I might be able to use my skills to help the department. Over the past few weeks, several neighbors and friends learned of the OPA Review Board openings and shared that they thought I would be a great addition to the board. After careful consideration and much thought I do think it is the best way I can serve my city and her citizens.

As regards my candidacy for the OPA, I bring experience to the table that will broaden the perspective the board takes in its duties. I'm neither a lawyer nor involved in the justice system. Rather, I am a thorough analytical thinker who has a depth of business, board and research experience. While limited legal experience may make the learning curve steeper for me, I do think the talent and experience I bring to the table will make for a more informed perspective that will ultimately better serve all of Seattle's citizens.

Professionally, I've had a diverse set of experiences. I started my professional career as a commissioned officer in the United States Air Force and am currently pursuing entrepreneurial interests at the intersection of the Internet of Things (IOT), Amazon Web Services and several infrastructure industries. Along the way I have been a venture capitalist and directly involved with the boards of both public and private companies. I led research efforts at Intellectual Ventures, a patent innovation firm in Bellevue, and worked directly for several of the founders – Nathan Myhrvold and Edward Jung.

In addition to a broad set of work experience, I also bring significant public safety experience to the table having been a firefighter in both New Jersey and Pennsylvania. I was an appointed officer with the River Road Fire Company, Fire District #2 in Piscataway, NJ. As a consequence I have significant insight into the public safety culture, mentality and camaraderie.

Finally I've been an active member of my Seattle community. In addition, to the aforementioned crime and environment meetings I was elected to the board of the Mt. Baker Community Club for the 2009/2010 term and served as the co-chair of the ZLUPT (Zoning, Land Use, Planning and Transportation) Committee.

I know that the job of the OPA Review Board is likely a demanding, thankless one. At the same time, I know that is critical to a well functioning and respected police force that serves the community. I have the time, experience and demeanor that would be a tremendous asset to the review board. I know that I would be a just, well reasoned and fact based member of the board.

Given my belief that public safety is the bedrock of a vibrant and sustainable city, it would be an honor to serve the City of Seattle on Office of Professional Accountability Review Board.
