- Positions through Associated Recreation Council (ARC) like Jr. counselors, basketball scorer and timers, and ball field attendants

### What's Happening Now

Program	Description
YES Youth Engaged in Service	Matches youth w/Parks staff mentors, operations, programming, maintenance
<b>STEP</b> Student Teen Employment Preparation	Team, project, and community based, provides training
SOS Summer of Service	Team, project, and community based, provides training
<b>TIP</b> Teen Intern Program	Individual or in teams, project based, provides training
TAT The Able Teens	Service based vocational training program, focus on independent living skills and socialization, provides training

#### What's Happening Now

Program	Description
Stevens Pass Clean- Up Crew	Team of teens organize work parties to pick up litter around Stevens Pass
Trail Crew	Team of teens restore and build trails and infrastructure
Mountain Biking Guide	Teen led mountain biking trips for other youth. Mountain Biking Guides conduct bike riding safety presentation
Rock climbing belay leads	Teens trained and certified as belayers in indoor and outdoor rock climbing areas
Peer Outreach Coordinator	Organizing, marketing and implementing special events for LGBTQ teens and allies.
Performance Artist	Perform at various events including, "Youth of Color Performing Arts Showcase"
LGBTQ Historical Figure Presenter	Research and deliver presentation on LGBTQ historical person of color at special events

# Youth Career Training Program (YCTP)

 Pilot program within YESL focused to increase capacity and diversity of youth employment opportunities

- Develop employment pathways with tiered progression model that increases levels of skill attainment, scope of work, and stipend amount
- Setting high and clear expectations throughout experience
- The development of youth and the strengthening of their families needs to happen simultaneously and ultimately building community



# What's Happening Now






Program	Description
Media Crew	A team of teens trained to use video and audio equipment and editing software to produce multi-media projects.
Ropes Course Youth Facilitator	A highly trained group of youth that can co-facilitate portable and low ropes course elements for other groups of youth or adults
Quick Start Tennis Instructor	Teens trained on how to play, coach, and interact with younger youth just learning how to play tennis
Swim Program Aides	Lifeguard trained, these youth support swim classes or programs within Seattle Parks and Recreation Pools

• # of youth interested = 1,493






# 2013 Highlights
