

Gentlemen:

Your committee, consisting of the City Engineer, the Superintendent of Streets & Sewers and the Superintendent of Public Utilities, to whom was referred the petition of D. McCuusten et al for the vacation of a portion of Martin Street, same being Council File No. 102714, having examined the matter, recommend that the Board go on record as favoring the vacation.

Martin Street is a 2-block street running at right angles to the north and south traffic, and so far as your committee can see, could never be a thoroughfare of sufficient importance to justify it being made 75 feet wide.
