

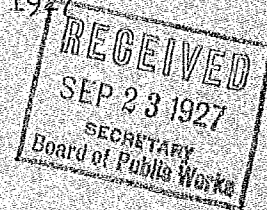

Herewith Comptroller's File No. 112437, same being petition of property owners for changing the name of 40th Avenue North, from East Madison Street north to McGilvra Street, to McGilvra Boulevard to correspond with 40th Avenue North south of East Madison Street recently changed to McGilvra Boulevard.

Reporting on this petition wish to state that 40th Avenue North, north of East Madison Street, only extends some three blocks to McGilvra Street, and is not a part of the boulevard system in any way, and it will be many years, if ever, before it is extended to Lake Washington and west connecting up as a part of the boulevard system.

In view of the fact that these numbered avenues are the only ones in the city that can be readily located from their names, I respectfully recommend that petition to change the name be denied.
