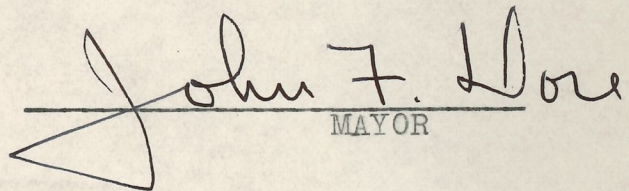
Gentlemen:

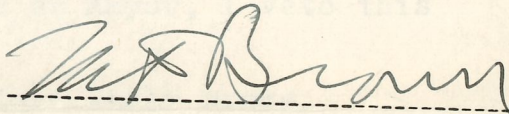

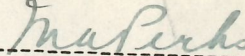
