WE, the undersigned, qualified voters and electors of the City of Seattle, representing more than fifteen (15) per cent of the total number of votes cast at the last preceding municipal election of the City of Seattle, Washington, hereby petition the adoption of a specified Charter Amendment, as follows:

That Article VII of the Charter of the City of Seattle be amended by adding thereto a new section, entitled Section I-A, to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII. DEPARTMENT OF POLICE

Section I-A. SUBSTATIONS AND PERSONNEL. There shall be maintained adequate police protection in each district of the city and there shall be maintained at least one police sub-station in each of the following districts in the city: one in the University District, one in Ballard, one in West Seattle, one in Columbia and one in Georgetown; the personnel of the police department shall consist of not less than five hundred and seventy-one (571) persons.

Said Amendment to be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Seattle for their ratification or rejection at the regular municipal election to be held in said city on the 10th day of March, 1936.
