Dear Sirs and Madam:

A petition for direct charter amendment, claimed to contain 20,000 names, was filed in this office today, and given File No. 149491.

The petitioners ask that Article VII of the Charter be amended by adding a new Section to be known as Section 1-A, to read as follows:

Section 1-A. Substations and Personnel. There shall be maintained adequate police protection in each district of the city and there shall be maintained at least one police sub-station in each of the following districts in the city; one in the University district, one in Ballard, one in West Seattle, one in Columbia and one in Georgetown; the personnel of the Police department shall consist of not less than five hundred and seventy-one (571) persons.

The petition was filed under a state law, enacted in 1903, (Rem Comp Stat. Sections 8963-64-65).

All matters to be submitted at the General Election on March 10, 1936, must be reported to the Election Board of King County on January 25, 1936.
