To the Honorable City Council:

Gentlemen,--

I transmit herewith to your honorable body a communication to the city council from the board of health concerning the sanitary condition of the Cascade School and asking that said school may be connected with a sewer and properly drained, and also report upon said petition from the committee on sanitation and sewers recommending that the board of public works make the sewer connection asked for and charge the same to the "school fund". This report was adopted by your honorable body on April 13, 1896. The petition and report have been handed to me with the request that I prepare an ordinance in accordance with the same. It is impossible for me to do so, as there is no "school fund" in the city, and I am unable to determine from the report of the committee what form of ordinance to draw without further report from them.

I therefore recommend that said matter be referred back to the proper committee for further action, and that your honorable body may take such other steps in the matter as you may deem proper.
