City Council County-City Building Seattle, Washington

WHEREAS: a committee will on this day, October 24, 1936, be present in Washington, D.C. to present demands to President Roose-velt for an increase in pay to all WPA workers, and for more adequate and proper relief for the unemployed and part-time workers, for union rates of pay on all WPA projects with the six-hour day and five-day week with no loss in pay for sickness or rain, or for any other cause beyond the control of the workers on WPA projects.
