Dear Sir:

Some time ago you referred to us File No. 164651, being a protest of Bennie W. Lyons et al relative to the building occupied by George Clark at Eleventh Avenue South and Forest Street.

After examining the structure, we are unanimously of the opinion that this shack should not be singled out and abated as a nuisance while similar buildings in the neighborhood are left unmolested.

The building occupied by Mr. Clark is an old shack on an unimproved side hill which is growing up with brush. It is some little distance from an improved street so that its location with reference to streets could not be determined. There are other similar shacks nearby.

Inasmuch as your Committee has under consideration the problem which confronts the City because of the numerous shacks in "Hooverville" and other locations, we believe that the matter of eliminating the shacks in the neighborhood of Mr. Lyons' home should be considered as a part of the entire problem.
