The tenants in the apartments on the alley side of the building have complained many many times about the early hour and the amount of noise made by the garbage men. The big trucks roar up the alley, the men talk loud and beat the cans on the edge of the truck body till everyone is thoroughly disturbed.

I have talked with the company doing the collecting but have received no cooperation.

The alley side of the building has forty-eight apartments and I can see no reason why the garbage men should be allowed to disturb their sleep as they often have as early as 5:15 A.M.

The garbage is collected every morning except Sunday.

The alley is clear of vehicles till 7:15 A.M. also around 9:00 A.M. it is again clear for at least a half hour. Either of these times would be satisfactory.

We will all greatly appreciate any help you can give us in this matter.

I am returning herewith file No. 170554, a petition of John W. Mallay, Manager of the Mallay Apartments, protesting the collection of garbage in the University District during the early morning hours. There is a large accumulation of garbage from the business houses along University Way, which is necessary to be picked up each morning.

The alleys in this district are extremely narrow and it is necessary that the garbage trucks make this pick up before morning traffic starts, otherwise they cannot drive through the alleys. We do not deem it adviseable to make the change in the hour of collection as requested. However the men on the trucks have been ordered to make no unnecessary noise, while making collections in this district.
