Gentlemen:

I am returning herewith Comptroller's File No. 171573, being petition of Hilda McManus for removal of shack from city street in the vicinity of 2027 10th Avenue South and Hill Street.

The property owned by the petitioner, Hilda McManus, is located on the northwest corner of 10th Avenue South and Hill Street, east of the Northern Pacific Railroad spur which follows the foot of Beacon Hill. None of the streets along this hillside, in this vicinity, are improved. There are two small shacks on the opposite side of Hill Street from the petitioner's property. A recent examination showed the premises around these shacks to be in fairly good shape and it does not appear that the conditions are as bad as claimed. Inasmuch as there are numerous shacks scattered along the side of Beacon Hill in this vicinity, it does not seem advisable at this time to take any action in regard to the ones complained of.
