

The Sunset Club, The Marlborough House, Mr. and Mrs. Joshua Green, Mr. and Mrs. Frederic Struve, Mr. and Mrs. George T. Myers, and Mr. A. G. Dunn are viewing this with resentment.

Mrs. Carlston has put a large sum of money into the place, and would very much like to purchase it herself, with a small sum down and the remainder on the rental plan. Will you kindly help us out on this umpleasant prospect.
