Transit System Cancels Afternoon Service Between Roosevelt High, Laurelhurst After Warning Boys

Rowdyism on school busses carrying pupils between Laurelhurst and Roosevelt High School has caused the Seattle Transit System to discontinue the afternoon bus, the Lau-relhurst Community Club an-nounced yesterday.

"Tuplis have been pelting bus drivers with missiles, on occasion have lighted stink bombs' made of photographic films which generate poisonous chiorine gas, and thein behavior generally is reported to be disgraceful." a club bulletin said. "Unless proper behavior is maintained, the morning busses also will be taken off."

All Laurehurst boys attending Roosevelt were called together two weeks ago and told what would happen if their misconduct did not cease, H. N. Gridley, principal of Roosevelt, said.

"The trouble, I believe," Gridley said. "emanates from a haxing spirit which is apt to develop where boys know one another as intimately as they do in a distinctive community like Laurehurst.

"Most of the mischief is carried out by the younger boys, who, haye ling become upper-half frehimen or sophomores, feel they must show their authority to the entering with their authority to the entering in freshmen. The older boys, for the most part, do not ride the school Minusses. They leave earlier and come home later because they are engaged in extra-curricular activities and sports."

Gridley declared that, if the boys to did not respect the privilege of having a school bus provided for their use, when busses are needed urgently for transportation of work-wing transportation of work-wing
