
Herewith copy of letter from the Supt.

The Board at today's meeting took action
to request the City Council to authorize the re-
moval of this fountain.

The City Engineer has reported that the
drain connection from this fountain to the main
sewer on 1st Avenue is broken down and a serious
pavement failure is resulting and that if the
fountain is kept in operation it will be necessary
to replace the outlet and repair the pavement at
considerable cost.
