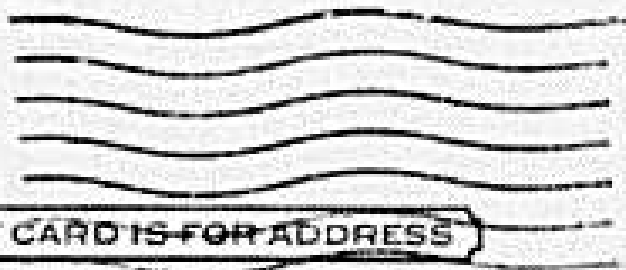


Honorable Members:

Attached is a reply from Don Johnston in reference to Council File No. 245267 being a protest against stabling animals in the basement of the Display Hall in the Seattle Center.

As stated in Mr. Johnston's memorandum, the basement area was designed for this purpose and has been used for such on several occasions in the past. However, the Seattle Center is now leased to the World's Fair and the use of the areas and scheduling of events is completely under their control.

Had we had control, we would not have permitted the stabling of animals in the Display Hall simultaneous with events being held in the Opera House.

MEMORANDUM

Attached is Council File No. 245267 objecting to the recent stabling of horses in the Display Hall, (Basement of Opera House).

First, might I say that this was done during the first part of the World's Fair activity when the buildings were under the administration of Century 21 Exposition. I therefore cannot speak officially for this agency that decided to stable the animals in the Display Hall area.

I can, however, appraise you of the buildings past history regarding such activity and give you my own recommendation.

When this area, "the basement of the old Auditorium", was designed and constructed back in 1928, one of its purposes was to accommodate the stabling of horses for horse shows in the adjacent Arena and the old Civic field. Floor drains, adequate ventilation, and secluded access to the area were all provided to accommodate such usage. Accordingly, there have been several occasions in the past years when the area has been used very effectively for the stabling of animals.

Odors are kept to a minimum by a deodorant that is introduced into the ventilating system for the area. Unless people are informed of animals being stabled in the Display Hall, they are unaware of such activity in the adjacent areas.

My recommendation is that the area still be permitted to accommodate the stabling of horses and other animals with the understanding that adequate deodorant and ventilating precautions are to be taken. Such usage does not violate any law, create any hazard to the safety of people or property, nor does it infringe upon the peaceful uses of adjacent areas by other events.
