

SECTION
I

The Police Department is responsible for the prevention of crime, detection and apprehension of criminals, and the safe movement of pedestrians and vehicles on city streets. The police force is distributed among 3 precincts with a total police personnel of 906 men and women with the power of arrest. It provides emergency ambulance service through the Seattle Health Department to anyone within the city, as well as radio facilities for effectual police operation.

Seattle's per capita full-time police coverage in 1962 was 1.89 police employees per 1,000 population.

The total of 1108 authorized personnel includes 61 school crossing guards who are paid by the hour for part-time work during the school year, 3 part-time cooks and 3 part-time matrons. In computing full-time police coverage we have deducted 3 civilians and 41 school crossing guards, leaving a total of 1064 full-time police employees of all classes.



Dear Sir:

During calendar year 1962 the biggest problem presented to the Police Department was, of course, that of Century 21. As the statistics in this report show, the crime and traffic problems anticipated did not develop to nearly the extent for which we were prepared. There was a substantial increase in offenses reported to the Seattle Police. The rate of settlement in all offenses, however, continued to exceed the national average.

There have been several significant advances for the Seattle Police Department in 1962. Some of these are:

1. The changing from one frequency for radio broadcasts to three frequency operation.
2. The modification and improvement of the City Jail to meet all of the standards necessary for certification by the U.S. Department of Prisons.
3. The deployment and use for police manpower so that maximum utilization is directed towards community security.

4. The transfer of the transfer is the first so far as is possible.
5. Continued upgrading the Harbor Police constructed landing in the harbor.

4. The transfer of the Women's Bureau to the Detective Division. This transfer is the final step in accomplishing the recommendations insofar as is possible of the Booz-Allen-Hamilton Survey.

5. Continued upgrading of the equipment, personnel and operations of the Harbor Police. This includes the placing into operation a reconstructed landing craft for the purpose of cleaning debris from the harbor.

The statistical section of this report reflects a 25% increase in Part I Offenses which appears worse than it actually is. This is an increase of 4,500 offenses. However, 2,500 of these were in larcenies under \$50.00; 800 of them in larcenies over \$50.00 and 300 in auto theft.

In the crimes of major significance, while there is an increase of 8% (552 over 513) in the crime of robbery, this is almost exactly on the ten year average of robberies. Aggravated assaults increased by almost 80% which, of course, brings the total percentage increase to a higher level. An analysis of the statistics though shows two significant increases directly chargeable to police action, that is, arrests increased 18% in the calendar year 1962 over 1961 and the rate of settlement of all crimes remained at a high level. One obvious conclusion of an exacting scrutiny of the crime statistics indicates that crime in Seattle is not of the highly professional or organized crime activities.




