

SECTION I

The Police Department is responsible for the prevention of crime, detection and apprehension of criminals, and the safe movement of pedestrians and vehicles on city streets. The police force is distributed among 3 precincts with a total police personnel of 902 men and women with the power of arrest. It provides emergency ambulance service through the Seattle Health Department to anyone within the city, as well as radio facilities for effectual police operation.



Seattle's per capita full-time police coverage in 1963 was 1.89 police employees per 1,000 population.

The total of 1112 authorized personnel includes 61 school crossing guards who are paid by the hour for part-time work during the school year, 3 part-time cooks and 3 part-time matrons. In computing full-time police coverage we have deducted 3 civilians and 41 school crossing guards, leaving a total of 1068 full-time police employees of all classes.

ORGANIZATION



PATROL DIVISION

Patrol Division consists of 1,100 men. Officers of the Patrol Division are responsible for a job which covers every phase of police work in the department. Cooperating closely with other divisions, the Patrol Division has accomplished its mission of maintaining law and order, recovery of stolen property, and protection of citizens.

STAFF DIVISION

The Personnel Office, Training and Identification, and Public Education are located in the Staff Division. In Juvenile Control, the division handles cases of minor offenders. Some time is spent in the preparation and conducting of studies on police problems.

DETECTIVE DIVISION

A general description of the Detective Division is worthy of some comment. The Detective Division is responsible for investigation of all crimes committed in this community. The Detective Division is also responsible for investigation of the many auto thefts in Seattle. The trend in auto thefts in Seattle during 1957 was 8% up.

SERVICES DIVISION

Central Complaints, Business Office, Statistics, Jail, and the Crime Laboratory are located in the Services Division. During the year 1957, the Crime Laboratory, were instrumental in solving many cases. The personnel of the Police Laboratory are prepared to handle any emergency.

TRAFFIC DIVISION

The Traffic Division is responsible for traffic control in Seattle's streets. The number of cars and pedestrian traffic increased during 1957. The high level of traffic safety is due to the physical fitness of the traffic advisory personnel.

PATROL DIVISION

Patrol Division comprises 562 police officers and 7 civilians, 52% of total personnel. Officers of the three precincts, Harbor Unit and Special Patrol deserve commendation for a job well done during 1963. Patrol Division's primary responsibility in every phase of police activity makes the "officer on the line" the backbone of the department. Cooperating fully with all divisions of the department, Patrol has accomplished its mission for protection of life and property, crime repression, preservation of the public peace, traffic control, investigation of crimes and criminals, recovery of stolen property, regulation of public conduct and special event services.

STAFF DIVISION

The Personnel Office, from selection to termination, handled the records for 1112 people. Training was completed for three academy sessions, specialty schools on explosives, identification and photography. The Public Relations Bureau expanded its program of public education in the areas of traffic safety, crime prevention and juvenile problems. In Juvenile Control, specially trained officers now handle declined juveniles and common offenders. Success in controlling Vice was a result of an effective exchange of information and coordination of efforts with all agencies. Designed to conduct staff studies on police activities, a Research and Planning Unit was formed on April 1, 1963.

DETECTIVE DIVISION

A general decrease in major crime was experienced in 1963. Exceptions to this trend worthy of some comment are burglaries and aggravated assaults. Burglary losses arising from thefts of office machines and television sets represent substantial losses in this community. Our experience leads to the conclusion that transportation and sale outside of this city and state is typical. Aggravated assaults rose 37%, but an examination of the incidents from which these cases arise indicates little opportunity for realistic preventive measures which are readily available to the police. A reduction in auto thefts over the previous World's Fair year resulted, and it is noted that the trend was 8% under 1961.

SERVICES DIVISION

Central Complaint Bureau; Records Bureau; Identification Bureau; Crime Laboratory; Statistics; Jail; Business Office; Property Room; and Kitchen are units of the Services Division. During 1963, Central Complaint Bureau averaged approximately 425 calls over the air in a 24 hour period. Laundry facilities, under the supervision of this division, were installed last year. Equipment and supplies, necessary for the operation of the Police Department, are issued by this division. Yearly budget requirements are prepared here. Statistical information is also obtained through this division. Personnel assigned: policy, 54; civilians, 117.

TRAFFIC DIVISION

The Traffic Division's primary function is the reduction of accident occurrence on Seattle's streets. In this it was successful with a 9% decrease under 1962. Injury and pedestrian accidents also were substantially lessened, but the important fatality rate increased. The program against hazardous moving violations rose, indicating a high level of enforcement activity by members of the Division. A change of top supervisory personnel, reorganization of functions, and the alteration and improvement of the physical installations, were the important innovations achieved in 1963.

Chief's Message

Dear Sir:

In 1963, 1,114 persons and \$8,839,969.00 were provided by the people of Seattle for police protection. The statistical portion of this report indicates that the activities of the men and women who made up the Seattle Police Department in 1963 gave the people of this community more and better service and a greater degree of protection and a higher settlement of crime than any comparable community in the United States. Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation, states:

"Serious crime in the United States continued its upward trend in 1963, increasing 10% over the same period in 1962. Cities of our classification (500,000 to one million) had a crime increase of 10%."

In Seattle, however, using the same standards and crimes to which Mr. Hoover had reference, there was a percentage reduction of 1.6%. Detailed scrutiny of the figures involved shows a better than apparent result from police and community efforts in the field of crime. Numerically few crimes in two categories caused a statistical imbalance without which the crime reduction in Seattle would be even greater.

In the field of traffic control, it was anticipated that due to several reasons, Seattle would experience a bad year. The Freeway construction, the continued adjustment of traffic patterns, the increased growth of suburban areas, all indicated that traffic accidents and congestion would be greater in Seattle than in prior years. Many agencies, of which the Police Department is only one, contributed to the reducing of the number of traffic accidents in Seattle and the reduction in the number of persons injured, than in the previous years. It was only in the area of fatal traffic accidents and the number of persons killed that Seattle showed an increase. Again a detailed examination of the figures involved in traffic will reflect that a substantial number of the fatal accidents were one-car accidents in which the driver hit some fixed object or ran off the roadway. This type of accident cannot be prevented by any method known to experts at this time, yet contributed materially to the increase in traffic fatalities.

An offsetting factor, however, is the fact that the percentage and number of accidents investigated by the Police Department was increased over previous years.

The City of Seattle shared with the rest of the country an increased awareness of Civil Rights. Seattle also shared with many other communities, demonstrations, sit-ins and picketing in this field. To the credit of the people of this community, on numerous occasions at numerous places, groups expressed their position in controversial matters without violence. Only on one occasion was it necessary to use police powers in this critical field. Then under the able personal direction of Assistant Chief Charles A. Rouse, arrests were effected without violence or without disrupting community harmony. His professional knowledge, ability and conduct and those of the officers immediately under his command were in the highest tradition of police service and with the support of members of many groups resulted in avoiding violence. The Police Department has shared with many groups, official and unofficial, in planning and preparation to make available to all citizens, all legal and proper methods of expressing their viewpoints. The mutual confidence between the community and local government was indicated in these sessions.


A figure in which the people of Seattle may well take pride is that juvenile arrests were reduced by 16% in 1963 over 1962. Full cooperation between all of the agencies involved in handling juveniles engaged in preventing juvenile delinquency has resulted in this rather startling reduction when compared to the rest of the nation. Efforts in this area will continue.

Continued careful scrutiny of assignments and activities of the members of the Police Department will continue to the end to produce the maximum community protection and a minimum of non-police functions. The anticipated substantial gains mentioned in the 1962 Annual Report in the fields of crime repression and apprehension of violators have been obtained in 1963.







VIOLATIONS COMPARED BY HOUR, SEATTLE, 1963


