

SECTION 1

The Police Department is responsible for the prevention of crime, detection and apprehension of criminals, and the safe movement of pedestrians and vehicles on city streets. The police force is distributed among 3 precincts with a total police personnel of 902 men and women with the power of arrest. It provides emergency ambulance service through the Seattle Health Department to anyone within the city, as well as radio facilities for effectual police operation.

Seattle's per capita full-time police coverage in 1964 was 1.89 police employees per 1,000 population.

The total of 1114 authorized personnel includes 61 school crossing guards who are paid by the hour for part-time work during the school year, 3 part-time cooks and 3 part-time matrons. In computing full-time police coverage we have deducted 3 civilians and 41 school crossing guards, leaving a total of 1070 full-time police employees of all classes.

PATROL DIVISION

During 1964 the Patrol Division continued its duties of preservation of the public peace, the protection of life and property, the enforcement of all criminal laws and ordinances, and the regulation of conduct in public places. The uniformed foot patrolmen and prowler car officers are divided into three Precincts, a Harbor-Helicopter Unit and the Special Patrol Unit. There are over 5,000 duties involved in the difficult process of being a uniformed police officer. These range from caring for the sick and injured to the arrest of dangerous, armed criminals. Every citizen of the City of Seattle is favorably affected by the action of the uniformed police officer who willingly offers his reputation and, indeed, his life, for the service and protection of the innocent.

STAFF DIVISION

Planning and Research received a Departmental Unit Citation for fulfilling a vital need in their studies and recommendations on the improvement and up-dating of police procedures. Training conducted 2 three month Academy classes for recruits, 30 one week In-Service-Training sessions for 750 Sergeants and Patrolmen. Personnel processed the records of over 1100 employees through recruitment, selection, testing, placement and termination. Public Relations expanded its public education and crime prevention programs. Vice, Intelligence and Narcotic Units continued effective controls in their areas of responsibility. Juvenile Control handled over 10,000 incidents involving juvenile boys and increased their efforts to control problem areas within the community.

DETECTIVE DIVISION

A significant increase of major crime throughout the nation was not experienced in Seattle during 1964. In some classifications, the national trend reflected substantial increases while Seattle experienced reductions over 1963--perhaps most notable in the property offenses, auto theft was reduced for the second consecutive year in contrast to nationwide increase of 17% at midyear. Aggravated assaults continue to increase in the community and in crimes involving property, thefts from automobiles account for a major dollar loss. During the past year, great emphasis has been given to the problem of identifying and recovering property taken in all offenses.

SERVICES DIVISION

Much of the internal business affairs is the responsibility of this division. Budgeting, business accounting, timekeeping, payroll, supplies and equipment procurement, issuance and control, evidence processing, examination and security, communications, records-keeping and analysis, and prisoner detention are among the major responsibilities. Records Bureau security was made possible by addition of modern mechanical records handling equipment. Federal approval of jail facilities was obtained in 1963.

TRAFFIC DIVISION

The year 1964 showed a decrease of 10 fatalities on Seattle streets from the previous year. The city ranked among the leaders in its class with 1.78 deaths per 10,000 vehicles. 114,884 citations for hazardous moving violations were written in 1964 indicating a high level of preventative activity. Enforcement of traffic laws is the primary undertaking employed by this division to reduce the ever growing accident occurrence. Other significant functions performed by Traffic personnel are Parking and Congestion Control, the School Safety Program, investigation of hit and run and other serious traffic incidents and the Police Reserve.

Chief's Message

Dear Sir:

The year 1964 found the Police Department continuing to hold the line and improve slightly the city's position with relation to crime. The statistical portion of this report will reflect in the over-all a small percentage increase in crime in Seattle.

Examination of the figures will indicate that this increase is generally within one or two areas, the first being the type of offense over which the police can effect a little control, and secondly, offenses which occur in such small numbers that a very few additional offenses will give an exaggerated percentage increase. In the areas of crime where police assignments, activities, procedures and planning can be effective, (robbery, burglary and auto theft), there is a numerical and percentage decrease. In the other fields, (murder, forcible rape and aggravated assault), there are increases. The numerical increase is not, except to the people involved, of any particular significance.

In spite of continued increase in number of motor vehicles, number of drivers, and number of miles driven, Seattle will show a 13% decrease in traffic fatalities for the year 1964. The activity of any governmental agency such as the Police Department is only one having contributed substantially to this decrease. The attitude of the individual drivers and the driving public as a whole must be given considerable recognition and credit to reducing the toll of lives on our streets.

In an effort to insure the maximum efficiency in the use of police man-hours and the police budget towards the end that public safety is achieved and to avail the police administration of methods and information which will keep this department abreast of ever changing techniques and solving new problems, the Planning and Research Unit was created in the Seattle Police Department. The first full year of operation, during 1964, for the Planning and Research Unit has been most profitable and gratifying. The need for such a unit in private industry and government has been well established and its specific application to city police departments is coming to the fore.

Its position in the organizational structure of a department falls naturally into the category of a Staff function. This position in the structure allows for the necessary flexibility of such a unit to cross over Divisional lines of authority to coordinate the total procedural activity, both within and without the department. The necessary ingredient for staffing such a unit is, of course, the selection of knowledgeable personnel completely familiar with the intricate and technical aspects of law enforcement.

This unit has been highly productive during the past year and the results of this productivity has resulted in substantial savings in money to the city. Perhaps what is more important is the improvement in the quality of the various every day tasks of the department which has accrued from the studies performed by this unit.

Many hours were spent in checking and following through on new procedures which were implemented as a result of the Planning and Research completed during the past year. Although the time spent in following through is time consuming, it is a vital and necessary part of the total planning and research area of responsibility and provides an opportunity for additional coordinating and evaluation of the newly implemented procedures.

Most of the major projects scheduled for action by the Planning and Research Unit in the very near future will include the complete revision of the Seattle Police Manual and the results of a total review of all department forms. It is anticipated that through consolidation, elimination and where necessary, new forms, this area of police operations can be made more efficient, more effective and greatly simplified. The outstanding work of this unit has gained for them a Unit Citation Award. They have established themselves as an integral part of police administration.




