Dear Sir:

The calendar year 1966 showed an escalation of people, employment and crime in the City of Seattle. The Seattle Police Department was faced with a substantial increase in requests for service and in increase in the volume of crime. The problems posed in the field of traffic control contributed more to straining the facilities of this department.

In 1965 the Central Complaint and Communications Bureau logged 163,082 calls. In 1966 these calls increased to 180,927. The statistical portion of this report will reflect increases ranging from 10% to 40% in the various categories of Part I offenses. It will also show an increase of 3,809 Part I offenses over 1965. Of particular concern to the police administration is the increase in violent crime: a 33% increase in murder; a 26% increase in robberies; a 14% increase in aggravated assault and a 26% increase in non-aggravated assault. The additional volume of crimes and services requested, requires adjustments within the Police Department to maintain the level of public security. This of necessity resulted in some decrease in activities which are primarily "service" to the community as opposed to protection activities.

In 1941 approximately 100 men were added to the Seattle Police Department. In 1966 this group of men, the

majority of whom were still employed, reached their service retirement age. In 1966, twenty-two policemen were retired for length of service. When these retirements are added to the vacancies created by the Council increase in the strength of the department, this department was faced with a maximum recruiting problem. This problem was complicated by economic conditions prevailing in Seattle. During the year 1966, however, the Police Department was able, without compromising recruiting standards, to hire eighty-one policemen.


A new unit and a new procedure were created within the department to increase the effectiveness and efficiency in the use of the available police man-hours. The Crime Analysis Unit, a new unit, is designed for the express purpose of serving the officers on the street with current information on the over-all crime picture in their district and to provide these officers with information which could lead to the solution of crimes that have been committed and, equally important, to prevent the repetition of such crimes. The mechanics of the Crime Analysis Unit are simply to RECEIVE - ANALYZE and DISSEMINATE. The effectiveness of this unit has been clearly demonstrated in such areas as thefts from parking meters, apprehension of car thieves in the act of abandoning stolen cars, reduction of purse snatches and strong-arm robberies.

A new procedure, Miscellaneous Incident Reporting, commonly known as MIR, uses an IBM card marked by a special pencil and the card itself can be converted to an IBM punch card without being coded manually or key punched manually. The system will not only provide information required by the Crime Analysis Unit, but will give the administration information as to the time, geographical area and type of calls, and above all, the type of police action needed. Further experience with the MIR procedure will result in freeing more police time for patrol without lessening the effectiveness of the Police Department.


In 1966 the program of using citations for offenses other than traffic where the public safety was not jeopardized was expanded. This type of program accomplishes three major objectives in that it enables police officers to handle the comparatively minor arrest situations by issuing a citation; it also eliminates the necessity for physical incarceration of people for offenses where this procedure is unnecessary and thirdly, it relieves the congestion of the court calendar.

By utilizing procedures such as those outlined above, and by continuous re-evaluation of present operations, the community may be assured that the maximum effort of the Police Department is directed toward the crime problem and community safety and that the present high level of security will prevail.




SEATTLE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Police Department is responsible for the prevention of crime, detection and apprehension of criminals, and the safe movement of pedestrians and vehicles on city streets. The police force is distributed among three precincts with a total police personnel of 941 men and women with the power of arrest. It provides emergency ambulance service through the Complaint and Communications Bureau to anyone within the city, as well as radio facilities for effectual police operation.




