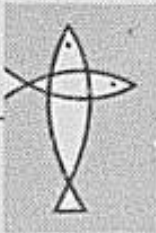

The Board of Trustees of the First Avenue Service Center went on record at its meeting on Tuesday, December 7, 1971, to urge the City of Seattle, through the offices of the Mayor and the City Council, to act immediately to relieve the acute housing needs affecting the inhabitants of the skidrow area of Seattle.

Human beings by the hundreds are being forced to sleep outdoors in weather severely detrimental to human survival. Your personal interest and assistance are greatly needed. Whatever you can do of an emergency nature in providing the three month grant of \$12,000 to provide 100 beds and 200 meals a day for homeless men will be very much appreciated.
