

HIGHLIGHTS OF 1973

Conditions most strongly affecting the Seattle Police Department's efforts in 1973 were the tight budget and the upward crime rate trend: 37 officers and 57 civilians were lost through attrition and the crime rate increased 10 percent. One manner of meeting these conditions was to take a close and critical look at the organization of the Police Department and make several significant changes in the Department's structure.

In 1973, citizen calls for police service rose 3.9 percent to a high of 501,756 calls handled. The increase in the last six months of 1973 was 12 percent and the volume continues this year with 5,000 more calls per month than in the same time period last year. Please refer to the attached Crime Report Capsule for a review of the crime index and the Part I Offenses, 1972-1973. Notice that the number of major crimes reported increased 24 percent in December, 1973, compared to December, 1972.

A prime 1973 activity included a move to the Arctic Building of several police divisions -- making room in the Public Safety Building for the construction of the new State Crime Laboratory to begin. This change also permitted the move of the Parking Meter Checkers into the police complex. Relocation of these divisions was accomplished smoothly and efficiently with little disruption of the functioning of their operations.

Several new programs were initiated in 1973. One was the attendance at a two week University of Puget Sound Management Seminar of all supervisory personnel above the rank of Sergeant. A more noticeable event was the development of the Horse Patrol.

The battle against traffic fatalities is a continuing one. In 1973, the total fatalities increased 19 percent, the pedestrian fatalities, 58 percent. Both 1972 and 1973 saw a reduction of sworn officers in traffic enforcement.

Other problems in 1973 continue on in 1974. One affecting everyone is the fuel shortage. The Police Department has taken the obvious means to meet this with the parking of cars and patrolling on foot, reducing heat, encouraging bussing, testing of compact cars for Patrol work. As a result of this testing, sixty compact cars have been ordered for Patrol and Traffic work.

Federal grant planning and management remains a priority activity with several new programs beginning as well as the continuation of grant projects begun last year.

Certain grant programs are designed to reduce specific target crimes. The Burglary Reduction Grant will test a variety of methods aimed at reducing the incidence of burglary. This will include team policing, community education and other support activities. The Police Department is actively involved in cooperation with the Harborview Medical Center and various social agencies and community groups in the Rape Reduction Grant. The Social Agency Referral Program for juveniles continues. This program is becoming known throughout the Department and an information program will be carried out in Patrol to apprise the field officers of the availability of this resource.

The third phase of the portable radio implementation will be completed this year. This will complete our efforts to fulfill the radio requirements of all our uniformed personnel. The field officers' improved output and effectiveness through their increased inquiries to the Sea-King Computer System will make us even more cognizant of the need for vehicle mounted terminals to reduce the air traffic time expended to respond to these inquiries.

Another project which continues this year is the Patrol Manpower Allocation Grant. We will complete a simulation model using response time as the primary criteria for allocating uniformed manpower. We will be able to subsequently use this decision-making tool to enable us to predict the optimum on-street manpower requirements to support any given range of desired response times.

1974 will bring the publication of a completely new Department Manual stressing philosophy and policy as a guide to decision making. We will expect an increase in individual effectiveness as a result of a higher level of understanding of our principal goals.

A trial system for monitoring case investigations will begin in 1974. Looking at manhours expended versus results on a case-by-case basis, we hope to develop the ability to assign our investigative resources to those cases with the highest probability of desired results.

We will carefully utilize our Training Grant to maintain and develop our expertise and to remain current with other law enforcement endeavors throughout the country.

All indications are that crime is on the increase, nationally and locally. With the extreme budget deficit and possibility of layoffs, the men and women of the Police Department will be hard-pressed, even with increased productivity, to hold the level of crime within a modest increase in Seattle for 1974.







COMPLAINTS INVESTIGATED BY INTERNAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION - 1973

During the year 1973, 375 complaints alleging misconduct by members and employees of the Seattle Police Department were logged and investigated by the Internal Investigations Division.

Upon completion of an investigation, each complaint was classified into one of the following categories:

1. Unfounded The allegation was false or not factual.
2. Exonerated The incident complained of did occur, but was lawful and proper.
3. Not Sustained There was insufficient evidence to either completely prove or disprove the allegation.
4. Sustained The allegation was supported by sufficient evidence.

In addition to logged complaints, 245 contacts with citizens were investigated by the Internal Investigations Division on a preliminary basis, resulting either in no indication of misconduct by police, or were handled by line command. The Internal Investigations Division handled a total of 620 complaints during 1973.

Regarding the 375 logged complaints, 19 were received from the Ombudsman; 2 directly from the news media; 25 complaints involved City agencies such as the mayor's office, City Council and Citizen's Service Bureau; 39 complaints derived from outside agencies and citizens' groups and 25 complaints were submitted by police officers, both from within the department and from outside police jurisdiction.

A total of 87 complaints were received from the black community; 13 from Indian individuals; 3 from Oriental persons and 6 from other ethnic groups; 49 complaints involved civil actions; 91 arose from traffic arrests; 98 derived from arrests other than traffic and 23 complaints involved police officers off-duty.




PERCENT CHANGE OVER 1964


DEPARTMENT STRENGTH VS CRIME INDEX





PERCENT OF CRIMES CLEARED 1973





PERCENT CHANGE OVER 1968





System statistics began in March, 1973.

The Seaking system, which became operational in 19 police agencies in King Administration and Seattle Municipal Courts. In addition to the local files, automated files in the Denver Information Center, Washington, automated state switching system.

In examining warrant service and two years subsequent of serving approximately 10,000 hand system. That increase from \$318,000 per year in bail actions served warrants with a face value of \$100,000. The system contained Seattle and King County.

During 1973, the Seaking system daily which is twice that of the previous year.

The following new applications were implemented:

1. Stolen vehicle reports vehicles from participating agencies.
2. Municipal Courts System tasks completed for the collection of vehicles and persons involved in those vehicles.
3. IDAS: A file in which warrant or name transactions that the identification process is completed.
4. Work measurement statistics.

Planning was also commenced in indexes in Seaking of all parts through 1974 with implementation of automatic examination of master selected police terminals.

An automated FIR file will be planned and completed for the records in the auto records unit ordered and will be operational.

SEAKING ALERT
CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM

The Seaking system, which became operational in 1970, now has membership of 19 police agencies in King and Snohomish Counties, the Drug Enforcement Administration and Seattle Municipal Courts.

In addition to the local files available, the system links this agency to automated files in the Department of Motor Vehicles, National Crime Information Center, Washington Crime Information Center and ACCESS - the automated state switching system.

In examining warrant service by our own department three years prior to and two years subsequent of Seaking implementation, this department is now serving approximately 10,000 warrants more, annually, than with the previous hand system. That increase in warrant service reflects an increase of over \$318,000 per year in bail actually collected. During 1973, this department served warrants with a face value of \$3,846,870 and at the end of the year the system contained Seattle warrants with a face value of \$5,280,578.

During 1973, the Seaking system as a whole averaged about 9,000 transactions daily which is twice that of the state crime information center - WACIC.

The following new applications were introduced to the system during 1973:

1. Stolen vehicle report: Daily listing of outstanding stolen vehicles from participating agencies in both counties.
2. Municipal Courts System: In addition to the administrative tasks completed for the courts, this system provides an index of vehicles and persons who have received citations while driving those vehicles.
3. IDAS: A file in which stolen identification is placed. A warrant or name transaction against the file informs the officer that the identification presented may be stolen.
4. Work measurement statistics for each terminal.

Planning was also commenced in 1973 for the consolidation of the master name indexes in Seaking of all participating agencies. The planning will continue through 1974 with implementation scheduled for 1975. The system will allow automatic examination of master name indexes from all departments through selected police terminals.

An automated FIR file will be planned in 1974 with implementation in 1975.

Planning was completed for the automation of the impound file and other records in the auto records unit of central records. A terminal has been ordered and will be operational in 1974.
