#### CHIEF'S MESSAGE

#### ANNUAL REPORT

As my career with the Seattle Police Department draws to a close and I present my fourth and final annual message, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the men and women of this department for their friendship and support. Working with you over a career spanning thirty years has been a rewarding and enriching experience that will not be forgotten.

1977 was a banner year for the Seattle Police Department and we have made strides of which I am especially pleased. Preventable crimes went down in all categories. While we experienced an increase in some crimes, burglary declined by 10%, larceny by 4%, and most significantly, robbery by 19%.

Although the members of the Seattle Police Department contributed greatly toward these results, we could not have achieved such notable success without the cooperation of the citizens in what has been described by some as "the most liveable city in the United States". While directing efforts toward crimes that are preventable in nature, the department joined forces with the community to combat Seattle's burglary problem by establishing the Patrol Alarm Project. The alarm unit, patrol officers, the Community Crime Prevention Program, and neighborhood citizens all working in concert were responsible for the success of the project and the subsequent reduction in burglaries.

As a result of the installation of alarms in private residences on a temporary basis, the program has contributed to 55 arrests since its inception. This works out to approximately one arrest for every 11.9 installations and credit must be shared jointly by a concerned, aware public and a dedicated patrol force. In addition to reducing incidents of burglary, the project was effectively employed in situations involving rape, arson, crime scene protection, and larceny. Most important, however, it has been an excellent vehicle for direct community involvement in crime prevention and reduction.

Another achievement of which I am particularly proud is the success of the Robbery Hidden Camera Project. In the past year this project was responsible for the successful identification of 24 suspects in 33 applications and cleared over 250 cases including robberies, burglaries, larcenies, and forgeries. I am sure that knowledge of the existence of surveillance cameras was responsible, at least in part, for a 50% decrease in the number of commercial robberies in Seattle during 1977. This project was also a result of cooperation between the citizens of this city and their police department.

I know that you will go on to even greater achievements in the years to come and I am sure that my successor will be as proud of you as I am. I salute you, one and all.







## 1977 Complaints Investigated by

During 1977, the Internal Investigations Section staff received 719 contacts from citizens with complaints or inquiries regarding police actions.

Of these, 384 were informational requests generally resolved by an inquiry into the incident and an explanation to the complainant.

Referral cases consisted of 199 of the total contacts. This type of case involved a formal complaint, but generally of a minor nature that was resolved at the supervisory level.

Investigation cases consisted of 112 of the total contacts. These cases were complaints from any source wherein the allegation warranted a complete investigation. The 112 complaints involved 145 allegations of misconduct, accusing a total of 159 officers. Twenty-six of the complaints were lodged by members of the black community, and five were by other identifiable minorities. Twenty-one of the complaints involved traffic arrests, and forty involved arrests other than traffic. Six complaints stemmed from an incident occurring at an off-duty hour.

Civil claims consisted of 24 of the total contacts. These included case files prepared for the City Attorney concerning incidents involving the police wherein a civil claim had been filed.

Upon completion of the investigation cases, the 145 allegations of misconduct were classified into one of the following categories:

1. UNFOUNDED: The preponderance of evidence indicated that the event described simply did not occur.
2. EXONERATED: The preponderance of evidence indicated that the event described did occur, but the actions taken were lawful and proper.
3. NOT SUSTAINED: There was not a preponderance of available evidence to either prove or disprove the allegations.
4. SUSTAINED: The allegation was supported by a preponderance of evidence and the actions were in violation of some law, policy, rule or procedure governing the conduct of department employees.



## SEATTLE TRAFFIC FATALITIES PAST 10 YEARS



### 1977 FATALITY FACTS

There were 42 persons killed in 39 fatal traffic accidents in Seattle during 1977, thirteen fewer traffic deaths which is a 24% decrease from the 55 persons killed in 53 fatal collisions during 1976.

A breakdown by type of collision indicates that 17 persons were killed in collisions of two or more motor vehicles, 12 involved hitting a fixed object and 13 were pedestrians.

Ten of the thirteen pedestrians killed were male, three were over 65 years of age and one was a child under 7 years. Three of the pedestrian fatalities were at intersections, one in a marked and two in unmarked crosswalks. Nine occurred during hours of darkness.

During 1977, Rainier District-Beacon Hill was the area with the largest number of fatal traffic collisions with eight.

The month of March, with 7 deaths, had the largest number of traffic fatalities. August had none and June only one.

## DEFINITIONS - PART I OFFENSES

01.a MURDER AND NONNEGIGENT MANSLAUGHTER\*\*\* - The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another.

\*\*\*JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE - Certain willful killings are classified as justifiable or excusable. In Uniform Crime Reporting, justifiable homicide is defined and limited to:

- 1) the killing of a felon by a peace officer in the line of duty, or
- 2) the killing of a felon by a private citizen

A killing is not classified as justifiable or excusable on the basis of self-defense, action of a coroner, prosecutor, grand jury or court.

01.b NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER - The killing of another person through gross negligence.

02 FORCIBLE RAPE - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

03 ROBBERY - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

04 AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

05 BURGLARY - The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

06 LARCENY - THEFT - The unlawful taking, carrying, leading or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another, without threat or force.

### LARCENY BREAKDOWN

PICK-POCKET - The theft of articles from a person by stealth where the victim usually does not become immediately aware of the theft.

PURSE-SNATCHING - The grabbing or snatching of a purse or handbag from the custody of an individual.

THEFT FROM PERSON - The grabbing or snatching of an article other than a purse or handbag from the custody of an individual.

SHOPLIFTING - The theft by a person other than an employee of goods or merchandise exposed for sale.

THEFTS FROM MOTOR VEHICLES - (except theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories) - The theft of articles from a motor vehicle, whether locked or unlocked.

THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLE PARTS AND ACCESSORIES - The theft of any part or accessory attached to the interior or exterior of a motor vehicle in a manner which would make the part an attachment to the vehicle or necessary for the operation of the vehicle.

THEFT OF BICYCLES - The unlawful taking of any bicycle, tandem bicycle, unicycle, etc. (except from a Burglary, Robbery, Rape or Murder).

DEFINITIONS - PART I OFFENSES (cont.)

THEFT FROM BUILDINGS - The theft from within a building which is open to the general public and where the offender has legal access.

THEFT FROM COIN-OPERATED DEVICE OR MACHINE - A theft from a device or machine which is operated or activated by the use of a coin. (Includes theft from parking meters).

LARCENY MISC. - All thefts which do not fit the definitions of the specific categories of larceny listed above.

- 07 MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is defined as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails. Examples are automobiles, trucks, busses, motorcycles, motor scooters, snowmobiles, etc.

DEFINITIONS - PART II OFFENSES

- 08 NON-AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - Any assault, or threat to assault, which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

09 ARSON - Any willful or malicious burning or attempts to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, church, college, public building or any building, ship or other vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft; contents of buildings, personal property of another, etc.

10 FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING - The making, altering, uttering or possessing, with the intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

11 FRAUD - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

12 EMBEZZLEMENT - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

13 STOLEN PROPERTY: BUYING, RECEIVING, POSSESSING - All offenses of buying, receiving and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

14 VANDALISM - The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

15 WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, ETC. - This class deals with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as:  
Manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons.  
Carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly.  
Using, manufacturing, etc., silencers.  
Furnishing deadly weapons to minors.  
Aliens possessing deadly weapons.  
All attempts to commit any of the above.

DEFINITIONS - PART II OFFENSES (cont.)

- 16 PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE - This class includes sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as:  
Prostitution.  
Keeping bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame.  
Pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.  
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- 17 SEX OFFENSES - (Except forcible rape and prostitution and commercialized vice.)  
This class includes offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like such as:  
Adultery.  
Incest.  
Indecent Exposure.  
Indecent Liberties.  
Intercourse with an insane, epileptic, or venerably diseased person.  
Seduction.  
Sodomy or crime against nature.  
Statutory rape (no force).  
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- 18 NARCOTIC DRUG LAWS - This class includes arrests for violations of State and local laws, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.
- 19 GAMBLING - All charges which relate to promoting, permitting, or engaging in gambling are included in this category.
- 20 OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN - This category includes all charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children.
- 21 DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE (DWI) - This class is limited to the driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- 22 LIQUOR LAWS - With the exception of "drunkenness" and "driving under the influence" liquor law violation, State and local, are placed in this class.
- 23 DRUNKENNESS - Drunkenness was decriminalized according to the Revised Criminal Code effective December 3, 1974 and on a statewide level on January 1, 1975 per R.C.W. Chapter 70.96 A.
- 24 DISORDERLY CONDUCT - In this class are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace.
- 25 VAGRANCY - Persons prosecuted on the charge of being a "suspicious character or person, etc." are included in this class.
- 26 ALL OTHER OFFENSES - This class includes every other State or local offense not included in offenses 1 thru 25.
- 27 SUSPICION - While "suspicion" is not an offense, it is the ground for many arrests in this jurisdiction. Upon investigation, the person arrested is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the

DEFINITIONS - PART II OFFENSES (cont.)

Part I or Part II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are investigated and released by the police.

MISCELLANEOUS DEFINITIONS

JUVENILE - Any person 17 years of age or younger.

JUVENILE "ARREST" - The word "arrest" as it applies to juveniles is intended to mean the police handling of all juveniles who have committed a crime and are taken into custody under such circumstances that were the juvenile an adult an arrest would have been counted.

ADULT - Any person 18 years of age or older.

ADULT "ARREST" - The word "arrest" as it applies to adults is intended to mean the processing of all adults physically arrested, cited or summoned.
