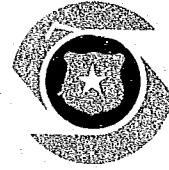

6. The Types of Unlawful Activity Involved;

The 1985 authorizations involved the following crime types:

Threats to Commit Arson/Bombing; Theft; Narcotics; Liquor Violations;  
Bomb Manufacturing; Fraud; Embezzlement; Extortion; Racketeering;  
Rendering Criminal Assistance; Bank Robbery; Homicide; Fugitives;  
Harrassment; Illegal Weapon Possession.

7. The Number of Prosecutions Based Thereon;

Two prosecutions have resulted from the four authorizations.

8. The Number of Visiting Officials or Dignitaries for Whom Security Precautions were Involved, and Other Meaningful Information;

The Criminal Information Section provided security for three dignitaries and visiting officials. The Special Patrol Unit supplied security on ten occasions during 1985.

9. A Summary of Internal Disciplinary Action Taken to Enforce This Ordinance;

No violations were noted -- no disciplinary action was taken.

10. A Description of Other Actions Taken to Implement This Ordinance;

There were two files which contained certain investigative information which could not be disclosed to the Intelligence Auditor during his last 1985 audit. The Auditor reviewed all other portions of each file except data obtained under a Federal Grand Jury subpoena, and from the Special Inquiry Judge process. In each instance, the United States Attorney for Western Washington and the King County Prosecuting Attorney's office supplied letters certifying that there was no data in violation of Ordinance #108333.

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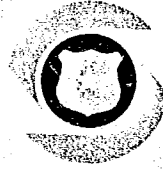
