Cal Anderson Park

This is an expanded Capitol Hill park site that includes Bobby Morris Playfield and the reservoir at 11th Avenue E and E Pine Street. The park is named in honor of the late Capitol Hill legislator and parks advocate. The playfield will retain the name Bobby Morris Playfield.

Hitt's Hill Park

This 3.2 acre Columbia City site, home of the former Hitt Fireworks Company, is located between Renton and Rainier Avenues S and between S Brandon Street and 39th Avenue S. The heavily wooded site provides beautiful views of lake Washington, downtown Seattle and the Rainier Valley.

Kiwanis Ravine Overlook

This is a small Magnolia park at 36th Avenue W and W Ohman that overlooks the Kiwanis Ravine. The Half-acre parcel the only flat section of Kiwanis Ravine, once housed a power station. Parks bought the property from Seattle City Light in the 1990's.
