- Whereas,** Sandra Jackson-Dumont has, for eight years, been Deputy Director for Education and Adjunct Curator at the Seattle Art Museum and during her tenure has radically expanded the museum's reach and influence upon new audiences; and,
- Whereas,** Sandra is the mind behind the incredible Remix program, attended by over fifty-thousand people in total, and revitalized the Teen, Family and Community programs at S.A.M., creating over six-hundred youth program and over one-thousand Community Partner programs and serving thousands of additional young people and residents throughout Seattle and the region; and,
- Whereas,** Sandra has, since its inception in 2009, been the lead curator for the Gwendolyn Knight/Jacob Lawrence Prize, awarded bi-annually to an early career black artist and providing that artist a solo exhibition at SAM; and,
- Whereas,** Sandra has served on the Seattle Arts Commission for the last five years, chairing the arts education sub-committee and making great strides in ensuring that arts education will be available to all youth in Seattle; and,
- Whereas,** Sandra's career in Seattle has been distinguished by not only her accomplishments, but also by her unflinching dedication to her practice and to the community; and
- Whereas,** Sandra is a visionary and a mentor that has left an indelible mark on the Seattle arts scene and on the professional and educational development of others throughout our City and, indeed, the nation; and,
- Whereas,** It is only through Sandra's work in Seattle and on behalf of our cultural community that we have the capacity and resilience necessary to continue to flourish in her absence;
