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To the Honorable City Council of the City of Seattle;

Gentlemen:-

The undersigned citizens of the City of Seattle, residing or having business interests in the vicinity of Interbay, being directly interested in the hereinafter named improvement, and having in mind the proposed erection of several drinking fountains in various parts of the City of Seattle by your Honorable body, respectfully urge the utility, and the claim of the residents and business interests of Interbay, to the erection of one of such fountains at that point, and in support of such claim respectfully represent:-

That the intersection of Fifteenth Avenue West and Grand Boulevard, at Interbay, is the centre of a large and populous district, being surrounded by manufacturing, milling, railway and other commercial interests; that it is on the direct line of travel between Ballard, Fort Lawton and Magnolia Bluff points and the down town districts of the City, and the transfer point from Ballard to Fort Lawton and Magnolia Bluff points; that it is a point where hundreds of people daily take cars for the down town districts of the City, Ballard and Fort Lawton; that the milling and manufacturing interests of the immediate vicinity necessitate a large amount of travel, hawling and teaming at the point of intersection of the above named streets; that a large portion of the lumber for Queene Anne Hill is supplied by the mills of this district, all of which passes over the point named; that at the present time there is not a place on the entire line of travel from Ballard, Fort Lawton or Magnolia Bluff the the business districts of the City, where ^{public} water is accessible to man or beast; that there are no drinking houses of any description at this point and the traveling public are compelled to ask for water at the adjacent stores or barber-shop when the necessity compels; that it would add very materially to the comfort

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and well being of hundreds of people and many beasts of burden if drinking water were made accessible at said point.

That Fifteenth Avenue West and Grand Boulevard at the point of intersection, are both wide streets and afford ample facilities for the location of a drinking fountain; that your petitioners would suggest the centre of Grand Boulevard immediately east of the east line of Fifteenth Avenue West as the most desirable point for the erection of such fountain.

WHEREFORE, Your petitioners pray that the representations herein made be submitted to investigation, and upon confirmation of the same that one of the proposed drinking fountains be established and erected at the intersection of Fifteenth Avenue and Grand Boulevard, otherwise known as Interbay.

Dear Sir:

I know of no place in the city where a public drinking fountain for man and beast is more needed than at the intersection of Fifteenth Avenue West and Grand Boulevard. All of the very heavy teaming traffic from Seattle to Ballard and from Seattle and Ballard to Interbay must pass this point. I believe more teams pass this one point every day than almost any other point in the city of Seattle, except on the main business thoroughfares.

I know of no drinking fountain for teams between First Avenue and Dennyway and Ballard, or a distance of six or seven miles. A great deal of the traffic originates between these two points and has no access to these drinking fountains. There is a great deal of freighting to Fort Lawton Amry Post with very heavy grades and I know of a great deal of suffering that has been caused to teams by lack of water along the road.

I am very glad that the Interbay Improvement Club has taken this matter up and that you have been appointed Chairman of the Committee to secure the watering place, and I am sure that an investigation on the part of the Committee will result in one of the proposed new fountains being placed at Fifteenth Avenue West and Grand Boulevard.
