Members of the CHARTER COMMISSION, Wm. Hickman Moore, Jas. B. Eagleson, A. V. Bouillon, E. F. Blaine, Thomas H. Bolton, William W. Calhoun, Wm. Pitt Trimble, W. A. Major, Josiah Collins, Thomas S. Lippy, J. Y. C. Kellogg, Chas. W. Doyle, O. B. Thorgrimson, Elmer E. Todd and C. J. Erickson.

That proposed amendment No. 1. relating to height of buildings, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT ADOPTED;

That proposed amendment No. 2, relating to the minimum wage, received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 3, relating to a Board of Public Welfare, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 4, relating to the powers and duties of the Corporation Counsel, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 5, relating to the submission by department heads of estimates of expense for ensuing year, received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 6, relating to the powers and duties of the City Engineer, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 7, relating to the appointment and removal of appointive officers by the Mayor and Council, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 8, relating to the powers and duties of the Mayor, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 9, relating to the power and authority of the City Council, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That proposed amendment No. 10, relating to the abolishment of the Board of Public Works and prescribing powers and duties of certain city officials, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT ADOPTED.

That Proposition "A" relating to the assessment of the cost of trunk water mains, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT CARRIED.

That Proposition "B" relating to the form of government to be prepared and submitted by the Charter Commission, received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared CARRIED.

That Proposition "C", relating to the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$250,000.00 for the purchase or condemnation of a power site at Lake Cushman, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared NOT CARRIED.

That Proposition "D", relating to the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$1,830,000.00 for the construction of certain bridges, did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared NOT CARRIED.
