THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the city council met in the council chamber of the city hall in the City of Seattle, as required by law, on Friday, the 5th day of March, 1915, at the hour of seven o'clock p. m. for the purpose of canvassing the returns of the general municipal election held in the City of Seattle on the 2nd day of March, 1915, and on said canvass finds that:

WILL H. HANNA, A. F. HAAS and THOMAS H. BOLTON were elected to the office of councilman for the term of three years;

Amendment No. 1, amending Section 9 of Article IV of the charter providing a method of calling special meetings of the council;

Received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared adopted.

Amendment No. 2, amending subdivision "fourteenth" of Section 18 of Article IV of the charter, prohibiting the granting of free service from city utilities;

Did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared not adopted.

Amendment No. 3, amending Section 11 of Article XVI of the charter, enumerating the officials and employes of the city not included in the classified civil service;

Received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared adopted.

Amendment No. 4, amending Section 16 of Article IV of the charter, for the purpose of giving the city council power to pass emergency bills over the Mayor's veto;

Did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared not adopted.

Amendment No. 5, amending Section 2 of Article XXIII of the charter for the purpose of giving preference in the employment of labor to citizens of the United States who are heads of families;

Received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared adopted.

Amendment No. 6, amending Section 1 of Article XVIII of the charter for the purpose of providing a preferential system of voting;

Did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared not adopted.

Proposition No. 1, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the sum of \$479,500.00 for the purpose of constructing a bridge across Salmon Bay at Fifteenth Avenue Northwest;

Received the necessary three-fifths majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared carried.

Proposition No. 2, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the sum of \$350,000.00 for the construction of a bridge across the Lake Washington Canal at Fremont Avenue;

Received the necessary three-fifths majority of the votes cast on said proposition and is declared carried.

Proposition No. 3, providing for the issuance and sale of bonds in the sum of \$545,000.00 for the construction of a bridge across Lake Union along the line of Eastlake Avenue produced northeasterly;

Received the necessary three-fifths of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared carried.

Proposition "A", shall the city purchase and operate auto cars to connect ~~the~~ Divisions "A" and "C" of the city car line;

Did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared not carried.

Proposition "B", shall the city extend Division "A" of the city car line on Leary Avenue;


Did not receive the necessary majority of the votes cast on said

proposition, and is declared not carried.


Proposition "C", shall the city continue the policy of increasing and extending the light and power plant and thereby reducing rates;

Received the necessary majority of the votes cast on said proposition, and is declared carried.
