We the members of the National Woman's Christian Temperance Union, in Convention assembled in Seattle, Washington, Oct. 24th, 1899, hereby regret that the petition of the citizens of Seattle for the closing of the saloons on the day of the arrival of the Washington volunteers has been denied by the City Council.

In behalf of the brave men and boys who have been standing, not for Washington alone, but for the Nation, we protest against the increased temptation which will be placed in their way through the open saloon and the proposed free drinks to be given by the saloon-keepers. Because of the cordial welcome accorded to us by the representatives of the Municipal Government we feel free to offer this protest.
