Gentlemen, Pass an act that
every female from 15 to 31 years
register in the City, appoint
a health board composed of
Lady Physicians as an examining
board giving such a thorough
examination, also a chance
for volunteers to present themselves
but make it compulsory, all found
in any way tainted with venereal
diseases should be interned in
camps fitted up for such get
at the root of the matter. Small
Pox has to be dealt with sternly

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why not get into quarantine
all affected with a disease a
million times more destructive
than smallpox, The disease who
kills and can't do no more can be
cradled but the disease transmitted
down from cradle to grave to bring
forth torture to posterity should
be dealt with in a practical
same way. By doing away with
this disease or that won't help
any, But get at the roots of the
disease, all women young
and old should get interested
concerning the preservation of
posterity, and the protection of mankind
It requires a strict examination
to pass muster get to fight for
freedom, For God sake give us
freedom from such a plague as
venereal disease, compel every

female to register and have
no exemption but give the men
who give up their lives for the
Cause, Companions to pass
must just as they do, and
quarantine all who are not fit
to be companions for them.

Give them mother, Sons should
have sisters and companions
not infectious in any way.

This remedy will last and bring
results not only to city but
nation. Let city authorities Petition
President & Congress to enact a
Conscription for a female army
from 15 to 31, drafted, and put
to the test for exemption as the
boys, and all diseases females
should be dealt with in merciful
human way and the Government should
inter all who is a menace to the

carrying on of battle against the
God in any way. I trust this
may find a way to your
hearts, to establish an ordinance
of this kind.
