Sirs:

The dock operators and merchants on the water front have been up against it the last several years for an easy grade from the water front to the Pike Street district, on account of the Pike Street Market being continually blocked with delivery trucks and wagons, as the farmers use Pike Place as a parking place and distributing point. Pike Place was built for the purpose of making an easy grade from the water front to Pike Street; but it seems that the original purpose has been lost sight of. All the traffic congestion at First and Pike is due to the market, because there is only one outlet and that is from Pike Place into First; whereas Fifth and Virginia is accessible in every direction.

We would consider it a special favor if you would do whatever you can to have the Pike Place thoroughfare opened up.
