CHAIRMAN

To the honorable city council,

Seattle, Wash.,

The undersigned committee of farmers representing a meeting of farmers doing business on the Pike Place public market respectfully represent:-

- 1. The Japanese vendors at said market should be segregated so that persons desiring to trade with Japanese may conveniently do so and persons desiring to trade with Americans may do so.
- 2. At present sertain persons, mainly Japanese, dealing on the public market, have dummy tenants and sub-tenants under fictitious leases each of whom draws locations at the regular drawings, whereupon the person from whom they hold such dummy leases or sub-leases selects and occupies, either in person or by some agent or employee, the most advantageous of the locations so drawn, thus being assured of the best locations on the market, to the prejudice of persons having only one drawing each.
- 3. Large amounts of golds are sold by Japanese vendors which are not raised by the vendors as required by city ordinance, but are purchased from commission merchants and retailed on the public market in violation of the ordinance.
- 4. Persons paying for the privilege of drawing locations should have their money refunded if they do not obtain locations.
