# PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the National Arts and Humanities Youth Program Award is the highest honor for afterschool arts and humanities programs administered by the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities (PCAH), in partnership with the National Endowment of the Arts (NEA), the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), and the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS); and

WHEREAS, out of a pool of more than 400 nominations and 50 finalists, the Wing Luke Museum of the Asian Pacific American Experience's YouthCAN program was one of just 15 programs across the county selected to receive this award at a White House ceremony on October 20, 2010 with First Lady Michelle Obama; and

WHEREAS, the Wing Luke Museum is the nation's only pan-Asian Pacific American museum and its mission is to connect everyone to the rich history, dynamic cultures and the art of Asian Pacific Americans through vivid storytelling and inspiring experiences; and

WHEREAS, YouthCAN is the Wing Luke Museum's afterschool program that empowers immigrant, refugee and/or low-income high school students, helping them build leadership, communication, and organizational skills through arts-based programming; and

WHEREAS, the Wing Luke Museum and its supporters are committed to providing the highest quality youth arts and humanities programs in Seattle based on the beliefs that the arts and humanities are the vehicles for all of us to transcend 'what is' and imagine 'what can be' and that developing tomorrow's leaders happens today,
