

Studied efficiency of work schedules, then worked with management and the union to ensure proper implementation of a new scheduling plan. This was done through attrition, cutting over 2.0 FTE's, while also reducing overtime, ensuring breaks, and improvements in customer service.

Conducted studies and authored reports on blood bank usage, working to ensure reduced waste.

Served as a bargaining member of the UFCW 1001 (now 21) Pro-Tech unit, being the main author of nine major changes to the collective bargaining agreement with GHC, including the health care premium share ultimately adopted (the contract was approved, after lobbying of co-workers, with an 82% yes vote).

Regularly served as a go-between with the union and management to avoid unnecessary grievance filings.

Worked with co-workers to ward off a decertification drive by an anti-labor group within our unit.

The Parks Levy Oversight Committee has sixteen members. Eight are appointed by the Mayor, subject to the City Council's confirmation; eight are appointed by the City Council. Representation includes one member from the Park Board of Commissioners. Commissioners serve three-year terms and remain members of the Committee until their replacement has been appointed or confirmed by the City Council.
