The Seattle City Council Budget Committee will conduct two public hearings on Wednesday, October 13, 2010, **starting at 5:30 p.m.** The hearings will be held at **The Jerry Brockey Student Center at South Seattle Community College.**

- The first hearing, scheduled to begin at 5:30 p.m., will be for comments on the City's general revenue sources for the 2011 budget, including a possible property tax levy increase.
- The second hearing, scheduled to begin at 5:45 p.m. (or at the conclusion of the first hearing, whichever is later), will be for comments on the Mayor's 2011 - 2012 Proposed Budget and will continue until all in-person comments are received.

At the hearings, out of respect for everyone's time constraints, it would be appreciated if members of groups with similar interests could combine presentations and stay within five minutes. Individual comments will be limited by the Budget Committee Chair, probably to two minutes or less.

For those testifying in person at the hearing, please sign in outside the door of the Brockey Student Center at 5 p.m. Councilmember Jean Godden will chair the hearings.
